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1. The meeting was chaired by Ms. A. Mimani, Registrar, The Assam Royal Global University.
2. Mr. Samrat Dev Sarma read out the MoM of 1st meeting and Action taken report. It was approved with minor correction.
3. Mr. Jugat K Bhattacharya, Coordinator of Open Elective Courses placed the new structure of GE Courses -

According to this new structure -

A student enrolled in UG level will study two GE Courses.

a) Students enrolled in BA/BSc/B.Com/BBA/BHM/ITM will study GE Courses from 1st Semester to 4th Semester.

b) There will be two lists of GE Courses - List-I and List-II. GE Courses to be introduced under List-I will be related to their Core/Major areas. Like a student enrolled in B.Sc. Physics will select mathematics as GE ~~and~~ from their list.

A student enrolled in any GE course under this list, can not change the course ' ' ' ' in between.

However, For BBA, BCA/BSc.IT, B.Com and BHM/ITM ~~dep~~ Programmes may design a track from First Sem to 4th Sem.



③ The Second list of GE will be open for all. No Pre-requisite is assign with such courses. It will serve the objective ~~the~~ of offering multidisciplinary programme by the university -

A student enrolled in different programmes will be getting updated list of GE courses every semester. All programmes ~~with~~ (UG) will offer two GE courses - one for odd semesters and the other for even semesters.

d) Students enrolled in different UG programmes will student this open elective course as under -

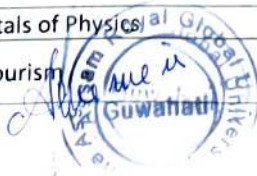



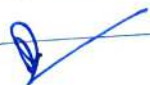
