BoS / RSP 1.1

Welcome address and opening remarks by chairman

The Chairman, BOS of the Royal School of Pharmacy welcomed and introduced the members of 1st Board of Studies and thanked each one of them for sparing their valuable time to attend the meeting.

BoS / RSP 1.2

To Confirm and approve the syllabus of D. Pharmacy, as per Pharmacy Council of India, Education Regulations, 1991.

Based on the suggestions given by the members, it is resolved to recommend the D. Pharmacy syllabus for the approval of academic council. The following points should be noted while approval of the syllabus:

1. As per Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), D. Pharmacy is not a credit based course. All the PCI approved colleges are following it as an hour based course. This credit based syllabus made by Royal School of Pharmacy based on the regulations of The Assam Royal Global University, Guwahati may create problem to get registration certificate for the D. Pharmacy students from the State Pharmacy council.
2. AECC marks should not be entered in the marks sheet. This will create problem to check the pass mark of the program as per PCI format. As all the institutes in India, following the guidelines given by the PCI, increase or decrease of total marks in the mark sheet will create confusion during registration with Pharmacy Council.
3. Computer courses can be added in the second year of D. Pharmacy.
4. Age limit should be followed while admission. Minimum age limit for the admission in D Pharmacy program is 17 years. Maximum age for the admissions can be followed as per the Government regulations.

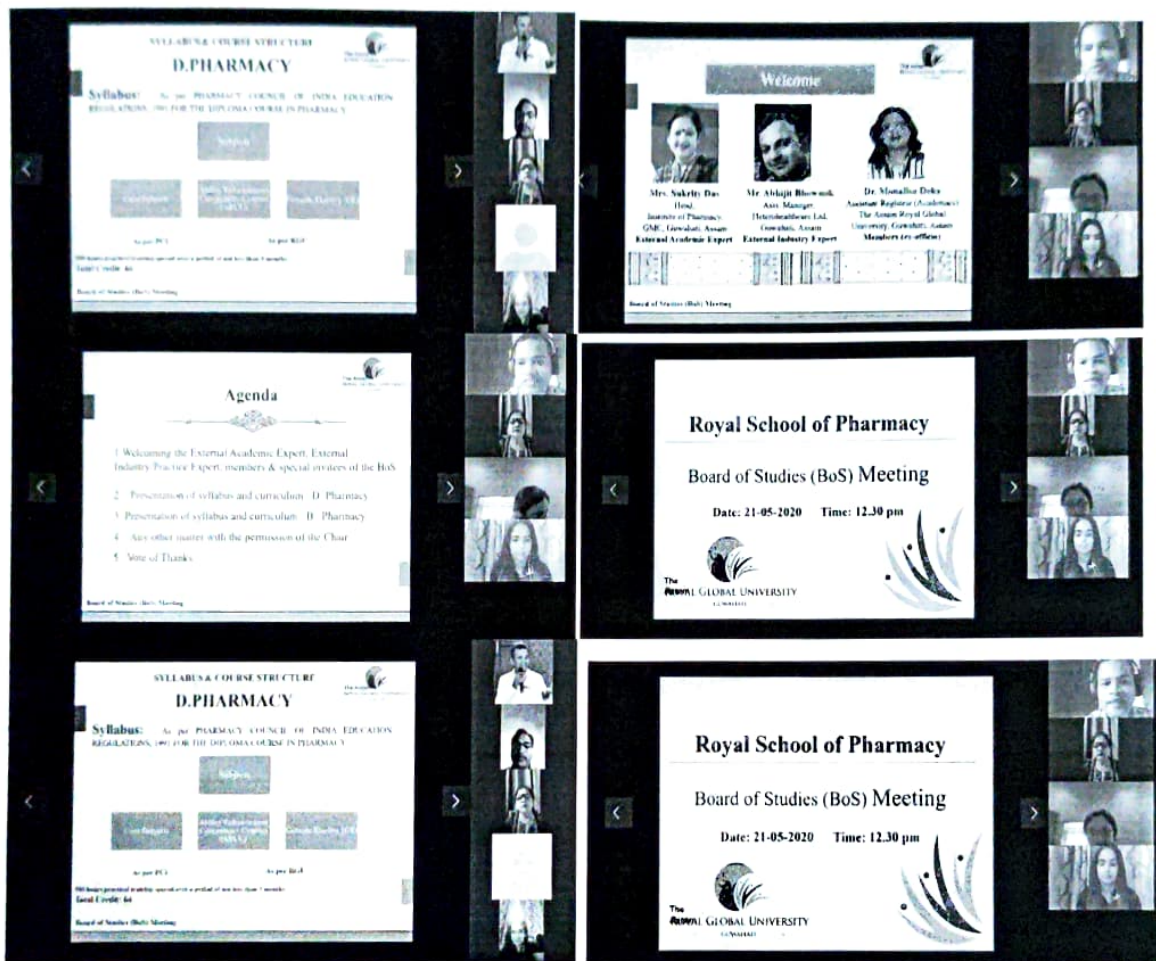
To Confirm and approve the syllabus of B. Pharmacy, As per PHARMACY COUNCIL OF INDIA [Framed under Regulation 6, 7 & 8 of the Bachelor of Pharmacy (B. Pharm) course regulations 2014]

Based on the suggestions given by the members, it is resolved to recommend the B. Pharmacy syllabus for the approval of academic council. The following points should be noted while approval of the syllabus:

1. Remedial Biology and Remedial Mathematics should not be mentioned as separate subject in the syllabus book.
2. Separate coding of theory and practical should be mentioned in the syllabus book.
3. Courses like Professional ethics, Disaster management and Sanitization methods should be included in Ability Enhancement Elective Courses.
4. Total credit of the B. Pharmacy program offered by Royal School of Pharmacy is too high, that is 269 (As per PCI, total credit mentioned was 209). This may give over burden to the students. This can be reduced by decreasing DSE subject as per PCI guidelines.

5. Inclusion of subject like Sanskrit in Ability Enhancement Elective Courses will help students to understand Ayurveda.
6. PCI guide lines should be followed strictly while designing the syllabus.
7. Age limit should be followed while admission. Minimum age limit for the admission in B Pharmacy program is 17 years. Maximum age for the admissions can be followed as per the Government regulations
