The online meeting was chaired by Prof. (Dr.) Soumitra Sen, Dean, RSHM & RSTTM, followed by (i) Dr. Saurabh Kumar Dixit, Registrar and HOD, Department of Tourism & Hotel Management, NEHU as an Institutional Expert for both RSHM & RSTTM, and (ii) Mr. Nirmaya Choudhury, Executive Director - Operations for Jungle Travels, Group and Chairman, North East Chapter of Indian Association of Tour Operators as an Industry Expert for RSTTM.

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4.04 Changes proposed in the BHM syllabus

No changes in the program is proposed. However, this is to be informed to the panel that the school of Hotel Management was advised to make its syllabus for the academic year 2022-23 in lined with the NEP 2020, however, the decision to adopt an in-lined NEP syllabus was dropped with the permission from the Hon'ble VC for the current academic year of the University due to the below reasons –

- 1. The courses offered by RSHM are purely skilled-based in nature and it is difficult to accommodate all the industry-required core papers into the NEP syllabi structure.
- 2. To accommodate all the core papers into the NEP Syllabi structure, RSHM had to incorporate the practical and theory papers into one single subject. (i.e. Subjects like Food & Beverage Service Theory and Food & Beverage Practical are now merged to make a single subject with both practical and theory element). Changes like these will certainly hamper the quality of the pedagogy and will be a compromise to the whole skilled-based knowledge.
- Also, a marksheet with no separate theory and practical subject may hamper the student as the industry might not accept them assuming they do not have the required practical knowledge to work in the industry.

MINUTES:

The current syllabi of the BA and BSc Hotel Management were discussed and as no changes were proposed in the 3rd BoS approved syllabi, the meeting was moved forward to the next segment.

4.05 Course wise discussion on the TTM syllabus

Discussion on various semesters of TTM starting from 1st semester to the 6th semester

MINUTES:

A brief discussion about the TTM course was presented to give a prior idea to our respected external as well as the internal board members.

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4.06 Changes to be made in the TTM syllabus

The syllabus of the UG Travel and Tourism Management remains the same, except for the first two semesters, where the syllabus has been amended as per the suggestion of the University's Academic Council which is in lined with the NEP 2020.

MINUTES:

The current syllabuses along with the proposed changes in lined with NEP 2020 were discussed. All the members placed their view point on the same and agreed to the proposed syllabus changes.

Mr. Nirmalya Choudhury, however, proposed to introduce a subject consisting of practical knowledge on Galileo like GDSs, on which he was informed that the School has already an active MoU with CN Travels, Guwahati where the students may willingly go for training for the said software knowledge.

4.07 Course wise discussion on the MTTM syllabus
