



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

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The Assam Royal Global University, a state private University, established by The Assam Royal Global University Act 2013 (to be read with The Assam Private Universities Act 2007), notified by the Government of Assam Gazette on 23/8/2013, herein after referred to as "Second Party/RGU", having its campus at Betkuchi, NH-37, Guwahati-781035, Assam. Starting its first academic session from July 2017, RGU currently offers multiple courses in diversified fields of Science, Engineering, Architecture, Humanities and Social Sciences, Pharmaceutical Sciences, etc. Established in July 2009 as Royal Group of Institutions, this institution which has now been upgraded to the level of a university has seen remarkable growth, accompanied by excellent academic results and successful alumni placed in reputed corporate houses.

OKDISCD and RGU are here in after collectively referred to as 'the Parties/Institutions' and individually as 'the Party/University/Institution'.

## 1. Purpose

That the broad objective of this agreement is to have a common platform for research and innovation / exchange of students, scientists, research scholars and faculty members/prospects for co-guideship / internship/ running collaborative projects/ joint consultancy/ training programs etc. and other relevant activities as agreed upon by both the academic institutions.

## 2. Anticipated Mutual Benefits & Interests

- 2.1 Together, these two institutions shall work towards furthering cooperation in education, training, and research, which will be mutually beneficial to both the organization and the people of the region.
- 2.2 The two academic institutions shall work in cooperation for research activities; training programs; exchange of faculty; summer/winter programs; extension activities; student exchange; bringing out joint publications & sharing of permissible information and laboratory facilities.

## 3. Types of Cooperation

The concerned Institutions envisage the following cooperation within the scope of this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU):

i) Faculty support for both the Institutions: Faculty Members of OKDISCD may be involved as esteemed members on the Board of Studies of relevant discipline and maybe empaneled as distinguished Visiting Faculty in some identified relevant schools/departments in consultation with RGU. Similarly, RGU being a multidisciplinary institution is agreeable to extend any academic expertise on request.

ii) Resources sharing: OKDISCD may consider accommodating some selected students from RGU to do their projects/thesis work at OKDISCD subject to availability of Faculty time and mutually agreeable terms. Similarly, such a provision may be extended to research scholars of OKDISCD by RGU, if sought for. Under such circumstances, students and faculty members shall be able to use facilities of either institute such as sophisticated equipment, library etc. after obtaining due approval from relevant authorities of OKDISCD/RGU.

iii) Co-guideship: There shall be a provision for co- guideship for research scholars of RGU by faculty of OKDISCD as per respective norms of the RGU and OKDISCD.

iv) Joint Research: There shall be a finite possibility of conducting joint research involving the faculty of both the institutions on mutually agreed upon areas/fields of research.

v) Joint Research Projects: Faculty members and Research Scholars of both the institution may jointly work on externally sponsored projects on chosen areas of interest Suculary Smuerte and expertise.





b) Interaction with teachers.


## **Student Interaction:**

#### Visit-8: Date: From 24th to 28th April 2023

With the kind initiative of our chief advisor, Prof.(Dr) Mihir Kanti Choudhury sir, three faculties of RGU, visited some of the institutions in Dibrugarh, Sibsagar and Tinsukia, Assam from 24th to 28th April 2023 (Monday to Friday). The purposes of the visit are career counseling, promotion, and branding. During the visit, the faculty members interacted with students and faculties of various departments in line with career prospects and opportunities of the students and National Education Policy 2020.

The team received an overwhelming response from the above-mentioned colleges.

On 24<sup>th</sup> April 2023, during the visit to Sibsagar Girl's college, the IQAC members of the college introduced the team to the students. The students are very excited to hear about NEP 2020 and also about the different courses offered by RGU. The students interact one to one with the team members. Also, during the visit to Nazira College, the RGU team members got a good response from both the students and the faculties. Many questions regarding NEP and clustering of colleges were raised by the faculties. Since the colleges don't' have enough courses to start NEP2020, they are worried about the implementation and the existence of the college. The rest went well.

On 25<sup>th</sup> April 2023, during the visit to Dibru college, the IQAC members offered a hearty welcome to the team of RGU. There were almost 9 faculty members and nearly 30 students from different groups. The students enjoyed the session and interacted with the team regarding scopes and opportunities after completing graduation. Next the visit was made to Aniruddhadeva Junior College where all the students are from HS. They were very interested in the talk regarding national education policies and career guidance. They have taken interest in the courses of RGU and have collected the contact number of the team. The last visit for that day was made to Nandalal Borgohain City College. The principal of the college, along with the students, offered a hearty welcome to the RGU team. The team members deduced about the NEP2020 and the facilities of the RGU institution like choices of careers at RGU and so on. They are very grateful and hope to conduct a seminar regarding career counseling with RGU in the future.

On 26<sup>th</sup> April 2023, the trip was made to 3 different colleges in Tinsukia. At Tinsukia women's college and Tinsukia Commerce college, the RGU team members have gotten a good response from both the students and faculties. There were more than 80 students accompanying with 5 to 6 faculties in each institution. An interaction was held among students in line with career innovation & growth, choices, and opportunities on RGU campus, NEP and placement system. The RGU team found that the students of Tinsukia college are having study leave since they are starting with their semester examinations on 10<sup>th</sup> May 2023 and therefore the principal proposed a later date, preferably after the semester examination for interaction with the students.

On 27<sup>th</sup> April 2023, the first college visited was Moran Mahila Mahavidyalaya. The program started with the welcome address by the principal, Dr. Jyoshree Phukan and introduce the team members to the faculties and students. The members had an interchange of ideas about syllabus

modification that will be implemented in NEP2020, RGU campus opportunities, Academic bank of credit(ABC), MEME (Multiple entry and multiple exit) etc. The interaction took more than an hour. The faculties of the college had put in many queries regarding how successful the NEP would be, how the colleges would start NEP because of the shortage of departments and courses and so on. The interaction went very well and it seems it was fruitful for the students too. The next visit was to Moran College. The RGU team were very happy to see almost a huge crowd of students along with 7-9 faculties. The principal Dr. Mitali Konwar and other faculties were equally excited to hear about NEP2020 and career guidance. The interaction also took more than an hour. Starting with the career guidance, ME-ME, ABC, NCrF, choices of career in RGU etc has been delivered by the team. Many questions about the distribution of courses and certificates at degree level were put forward. Also , job opportunities after implementation of NEP2020 were also discussed. All were answered by the RGU team and the students were highly motivated.

On the last day of the institutional visit i.e., on 28<sup>th</sup> May 2023, two colleges were visited, Dibrugarh Commerce College and Salt Brook Academy. Both the colleges had more than 50 students with faculties. The principal of Dibrugarh Commerce college also proposed to having an MoU with RGU for the exchange programme. They are very excited to hear about the placement program that RGU holds. They were equally excited to hear about NEP2020, the difference courses offered by RGU and different aspects of career counseling. Also, Salt Brook Academy showed equal interest in the speech delivered by the RGU team. Since the students are all from HS level, they are very excited to know about the career prospects after pursuing a bachelor's degree. They have asked about how NEP2020 is going to be implemented in engineering and medical courses. The session went smoothly, though the students had lots of questions on their mind.


