3. 

ROYAL ANNA SEWA

The Assam Royal Global University, a non-profit charitable society primarily dedicated to education and social welfare, has taken several initiatives aimed at promoting education and food security for vulnerable sections of society. As part of their Urban Social Responsibility (USR) efforts, they have launched the "ROYAL ANNA SEVA" project, which involves daily distribution of 100 lunch packets to needy and deprived individuals across the city.

During the challenging period of the COVID-19 pandemic, the university extended its support by distributing food materials among the poor and needy. This initiative significantly contributed to addressing the food security concerns of the most vulnerable individuals in the community.

The Department of Social Work at the university, in collaboration with the National Service Scheme (NSS-RGU), initiated this campaign on May 26, 2022. The campaign encompasses various locations across the city, with a focus on serving the vulnerable sections of society and addressing their food security needs. These efforts reflect the university's commitment to both education and the essential food security needs of the most disadvantaged members of the community, showcasing a holistic approach to social responsibility and community service.

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




