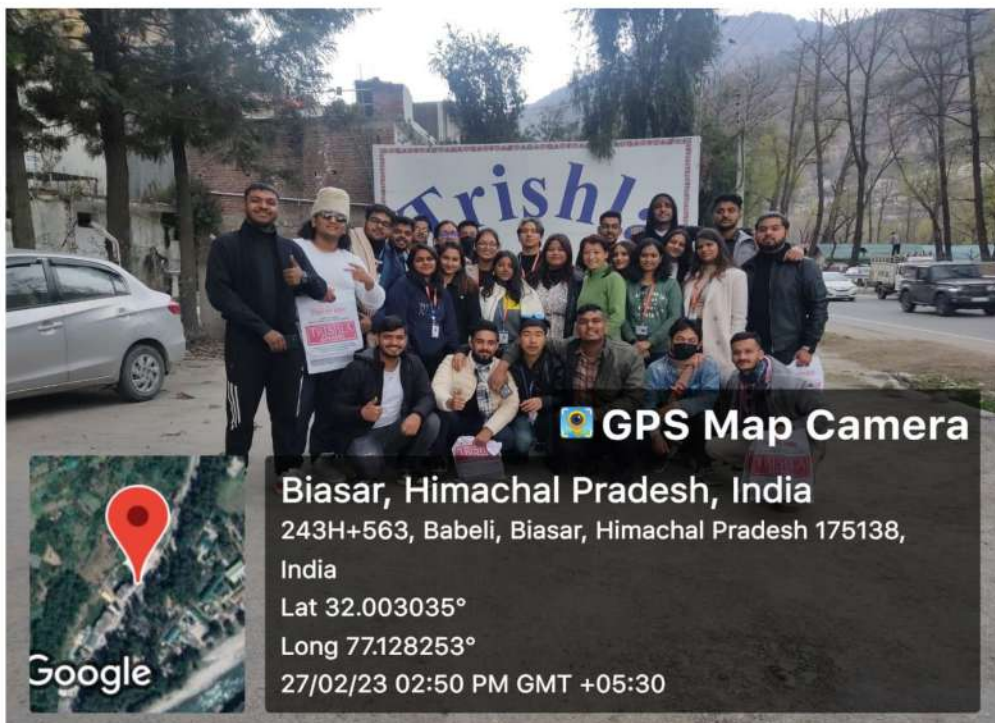

Their trip to **Trishla Shawl Factory and Bhuttico Cooperative Textile Society** familiarized them with the manufacturing process of shawls, mufflers and other products. This trip helped them understand profit oriented and cause oriented business organization, the importance of handloom industry and the society of weavers it creates as a by-product. They also explored different local markets and tourism opportunities of the place.



16. On 25th February, 2023 at the Blue Core Energy CBG Plant, Damora Pothar, Sonapur. 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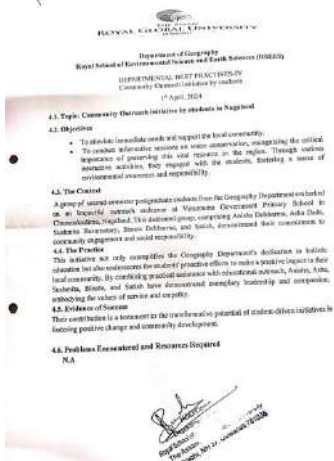

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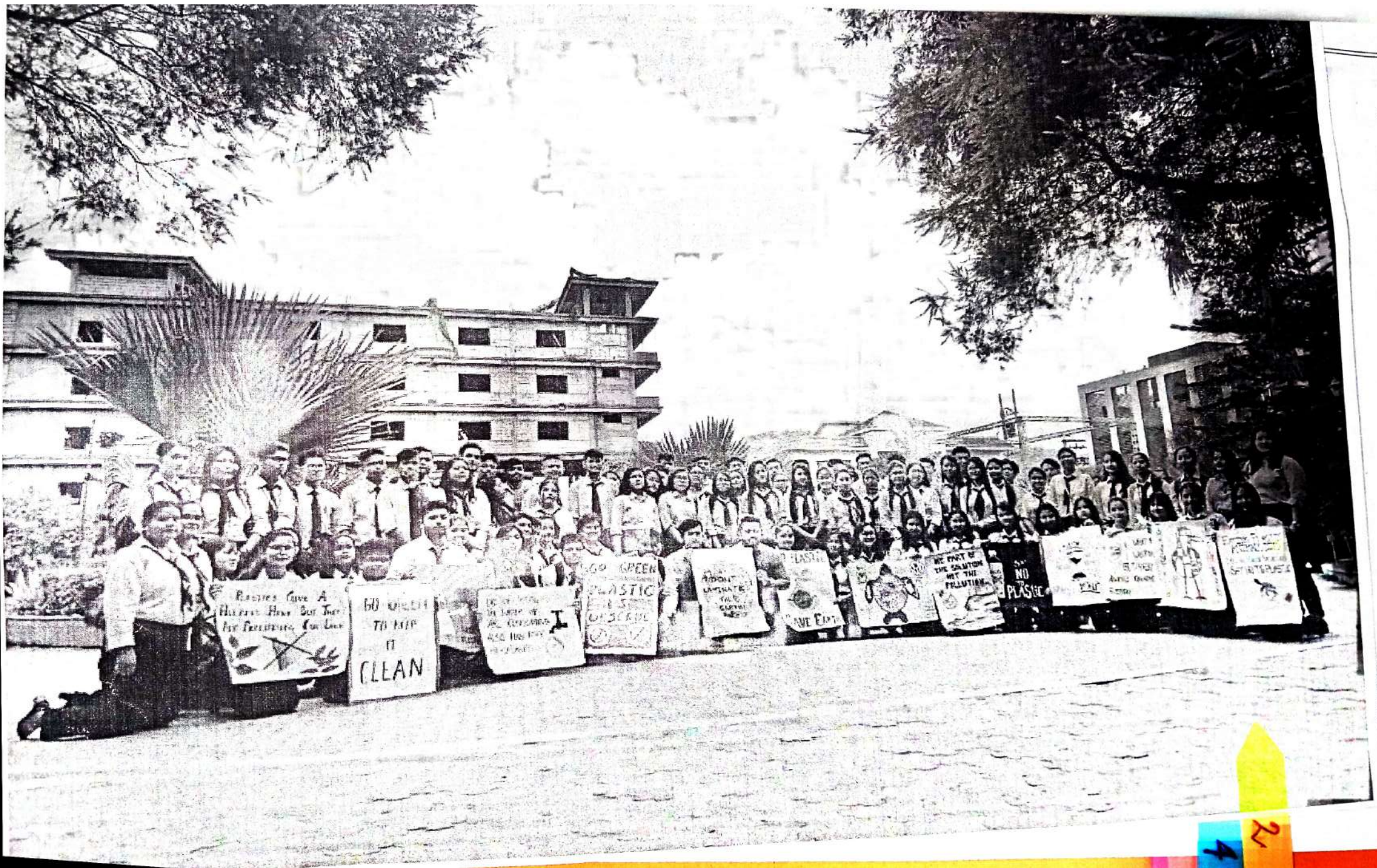
