

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Executive Summary



The year 2017 holds great importance as the year of 'the journey forward' for The Assam Royal Global University (RGU). With 793 number of students admitted in undergraduate, postgraduate and Ph.D. programs in 13 schools and 55 programmes, we deem it to be a wonderful start for the onward journey of the University.

This University is governed, in all matters, by the Act, Statutes, Ordinances etc., each of which sets out responsibilities of power of the statutory offices, conduct of business and such other matters. With able stewardship of the statutory bodies like the Governing Body, Academic Council, Board of Management and the Boards of Studies, constituted of eminent academicians and administrators of repute, RGU steers in the right direction.

A balanced demography of the students' community is an

essential facet of any university. In order to maintain and facilitate the right blend of cultural diversity sought in a university environment, RGU has opened information centres in Assam (Tezpur, Jorhat, Dibrugarh, Bongaigaon, Pathsala) and few states surrounding Assam, namely, Meghalaya and Manipur. Students from as far as South Korea have applied in courses of the university through the online portal. The online system provides ease of access to students desiring to pursue their higher studies in the country and, particularly in The Assam Royal Global University. There are also those who make us proud in many fields of endeavour, including academic achievements and co-curricular activities at all levels. Further, to motivate and support the brilliant students, the university has offered scholarships to 25 students under two broad categories viz. The Royal Merit Scholarship and The Royal Endowment Scholarship.

The university has been successful in opening and operating a psychological counseling center to take care of the mental health of the students, scholars and employees. Integral parts of the student-centric bodies also include the Mentor-Mentee System, Clubs (altogether 9 clubs functioning across the university), Royal Centre for Corporate Relations and the University Proctorial Board.

In the first year itself, the university has achieved academic advancement by signing MoU with Mendel University, Checz Republic.

With 43,000 reference materials (books, e-books, journals, newspapers, and software/online resources) in the library, 59 publications by faculty members in journals, conferences and books, 318 academic and industry oriented activities (workshops, seminars, conferences, FDP, Outreach activities), the University has made every attempt to provide a very progressive academic environment to its students and faculty.

The university stands strong with up-to-date curricula, a competent and professional team ready to steer the journey forward with dignity, ethics and integrity.

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1. An Overview

The Assam Royal Global University (RGU), a State Private University, established by The Assam Royal Global University Act 2013, notified by the Government of Assam Gazette on 20/08/2013, started its first academic session from July 2017, by offering 55 courses under its 13 schools in diverse fields.

Established in July 2009 as Royal Group of Institutions, which has now been merged into The Assam Royal Global University, the University is located near Tirupati Balaji Temple on National Highway and spans across 37,000 square meter (4 lakh square feet) of built-up centrally air-conditioned structures.

1.6 University Infrastructure

The Assam Royal Global University is located against the picturesque backdrop of Tirupati Balaji Temple on National Highway 37. The Wi-Fi and centrally air-conditioned campus with three blocks, labeled A, B and C has 65 hi-tech labs, an Auditorium, a Conferencia, a Colloquium, a Seminar Hall and amphitheater type classrooms.

Facilities

• Hostel

The hostels viz. Aditya House (Boys' Hostel) and Harsha House (Girls' Hostel), are centrally air-conditioned. Availability of round the clock electricity, water supply and internet are special features of these 'Home Away from Home' for the students. Other facilities include Gymnasium, TV sets, personal wardrobes, reading rooms, bathrooms in each cluster; two/three bedded rooms, lift and 24x7 infirmary.

• Sports

Besides facilities for outdoor games, "The Cube", an international-standard indoor sports complex, offers facilities for badminton, squash, billiards, table tennis etc.

• Health Care

In addition to the two infirmaries, an ambulance is also available twenty-four hours a day. The University also has tie-ups with exclusive city-based multispecialty hospitals.



Campus Security

Round-the-clock manual security and CCTV surveillance plus a provision for raising fire alarms render the university-living safe.

• Transport

The University possesses a fleet of A.C. buses for picking and dropping of students and staff. The buses are also used for industrial and any other academic day trips.

• Cafeteria

Three vegetarian cafes cater to the food demand of the students, staff and visitors.

Infrastructure Development

Construction of a new six-storied building, about 18,500 square meter (2 lakh square feet) built-up area, has been undertaken to add three new academic blocks D, E and F to the existing campus of about 37,000 square meter (4 lakh square feet) housing academic blocks A, B and C.

2. School Board shall be the principal academic body of the School. It shall have the following powers and functions:

- a) To coordinate the teaching and research works in the programmes assigned to the school.
- b) To appoint committees of courses for School's teaching, wherever required, and to supervise the work of such committees.
- c) To recommend to the Academic Council, the courses and syllabi of Studies in the various programmes assigned to the school.
- d) To consider schemes for the advancement of the standards of tecahing and research, and to submit such proposals to the Academic Council.
- e) To promote and consider schemes for interaction with industry and to submit such proposals to the Academic Council/ Vice-Chancellor.
- f) To prepare and formulate schemes for faculty development and to submit such proposals to Vice-Chancellor/ Acadmeic Council.
- g) To consider feedback reports on the placement and employablity of the passed out students and to suggest remedial measures wherever necessary for consideration of Vice-Chancellor/ Academic Council.
- h) To consider proposals for revenue generation including professional consultancies, resource sharing etc. and submit such proposals to Vice-Chancellor.

3.4 Royal Centre for Research, Publications, Projects & Patents (RCRPPP)

In a fast-developing world, the role of research in an academic institution is significant for its sustainability and development, and therefore, it is imperative to have knowledge-driven growth based on innovation. Detailed research equips students with critical thinking expertise, as well as effective analytical, research, and communication skills, that are globally sought-after. Therefore, to promote research in the University and impart these qualities to the students of RGU, Royal Centre for Research, Publication, Projects & Patents (RCRPPP) has been constituted.

3.5 Royal Centre for Counselling and Career (RCCC)

Days of higher education are very absorbing and exciting in one's life. However, for a few students, it may, at times, bring about common emotional challenges, e.g. depression, anxiety, addiction, eating disorders, etc. Adolescence can be a time of both disorientation and discovery. This transitional period can bring up issues related to independence and self-identity. Many adolescents and their peers face tough choices regarding school, sexuality, drugs, alcohol, and social life. Peer groups, romantic inclinations and appearances tend to dominate during a teen's journey to adulthood.

To address the problems as above, RGU has launched 'Royal Centre for



Counselling and Career (RCCC)', especially for those students who find life going tough.

3.6 Royal Centre for Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Tie-Ups (RCIET)

RCIET was formally constituted with the aim to foster a vibrant ecosystem for the creation and growth of knowledge and research-driven enterprises. The objectives of the centre are:

- To create and disseminate domain-wise research-based knowledge in the areas of innovation and entrepreneurship that influence education, practice and policy for the emerging needs and markets.
- To utilize the knowledge and expertise to contribute and promote innovation, entrepreneurial approaches to address socio-economic challenges.
- To support purpose-driven entrepreneurial endeavours and growth aspirations in key sectors including technology commercialization in collaboration with internal and external partners.

3.7 Royal Centre for Act East Policy (RCAEP)

The 'Act East Policy', as enunciated by the Government of India, has made a deep impression in the minds and hearts of every Indian. With the objective of creating an awareness for Research and Studies amongst its faculty and students, the Royal Centre for Act East Policy has been set up. The Centre seeks to achieve its objectives through workshops, seminars, lectures, research collaborations and cultural events as well as publications and extensive dissemination.

- The research focus will include migration and transnationalism; gender and discrimination; conflict and livelihood issues; ethnicity and identity politics; water, environment and climate change; North-East India and its peripheral areas; traditional institutions and India's Act East Policy. Research studies and several professional studies are the goals of the Centre.
- Documentation Centre: Documentation and extensive dissemination of in-depth knowledge of the policy will be required.
- Events: Lectures and talks by experts followed by discussion, seminars, conferences and workshops.
- Articles for Journal: Multi-disciplinary write ups on Act East Policy are to be published in a Journal, Newspaper, Magazine etc.

3.8 Royal University Press (RUP) (Designing and Printing)

3.9 Royal Centre for Water Resource Management (RCWRM)

Royal Centre for Water Resource Management (RCWRM) was established in March 2017 under the Assam Royal Global University (RGU), Guwahati, and the centre is attached to the Department of Civil Engineering, Royal School of Engineering & Technology. Its main objectives are to pursue teaching, research, consultancy and to conduct training programmes in (a) hydrology, (b) water resources engineering, (c) development & management, (d) irrigation management and water quality, and (e) water quantity management. It is basically an extension of the Department of Civil Engineering. 
During the year, a month-long Faculty Seminar Series was organized where active participation by teachers from all schools made the deliberations interactive and refreshing.

6. Library

Spread over 743 square meter (8000 square feet), the Central Library of RGU is a well furnished, centrally air-conditioned, duplex-type library. Situated in first and second floors of B block, the library is a hub for academic queries and research activities. The library is fully computerized and provides essential information on knowledge related to engineering, management, architecture, law, commerce, fashion, fine arts, etc. The total collection stands at 7,048 titles and 22,051 volumes of printed books, 3,048 e-books, 26 printed and 67,125 e-journals. The various e-resources available include: e-journals, e-books and e-databases under different areas. The database for the entire collection can be accessed through Online Public Access Catalogue (WebOPAC). Apart from this, the library holds special collection on North-East, competitive and fiction/non-fiction corners. The library subscribes to eight daily newspapers and a number of reputed magazines. The library management is done by ILMS SOUL 2.0 server platform and barcode system (Jan, 2013). As a member of DELNET, the library avails various facilities of member institutions through resource sharing, on demand from the users, as and when required. It provides ready reference service like Content List Service, using both offline and online sources of information to the users.

6.1 Library Advisory Committee

"Library Advisory Committee" is the apex body for the development, rules and regulations, policy matters regarding procurement of books, journals and e-resources of the library. The committee





comprises of 11 members with the Vice-Chancellor, as the Chairman; the Librarian as the Ex- Officio Member Secretary; the Registrar; few Deans, HoDs and senior professors as members.

7. Student Affairs

7.1 Examination System

A duly constituted Examination Committee is in-charge of the entire process of holding the exams at RGU. The syllabus of every theory paper has been divided into 4 (four) units, each having equal weightage. The semester-end exam question paper is so set that each unit of the syllabus finds equal weightage and a student is tested for every unit.

The results of semester-end examinations are published on the RGU website within 30 days of the last exam held.

7.1.1 GRADING SYSTEM

The Assam Royal Global University follows Relative Grading System wherein a student's performance is assessed in comparison to others in the class. The point values are not directly assigned to a letter grade. It builds competitiveness among students to stand out in relation to others. However, Relative Grading in RGU shall be applicable only when the students' strength in a class is more than 30; otherwise, for class strength up to 30, Absolute Grading System is followed.

Passing Criteria: For UG courses, a student shall have to obtain SGPA of 4.5 in every semester and CGPA of 5 in each year. For PG courses, a student shall have to obtain SGPA of 5 in every semester and CGPA of 6 in each year.

Promotion Criteria: For UG courses, a student shall have to obtain SGPA of 3.5 in every semester and CGPA of 4.5 in each year. For PG courses, a student shall have to obtain SGPA of 4.5 in every semester and CGPA of 5 in each year.

Examination Rules, as mentioned in Ordinance, do not permit a student to be promoted to 3rd Year until and unless the student achieves Passing Criteria in his/her 1st Year.

7.1.2 EVALUATION SYSTEM

The evaluation system of a paper for a course under The Assam Royal Global University is divided as per the following:

1. The Continuous Evaluation component is re-divided as per the following connotation:

• Class Participation (15%)

Every student's progress and performance is continuously adjudged throughout the semester in different ways such as Class Tests, Viva, Assignments, Project Work, and Seminars etc. 15% marks are allotted under the head 'Class Participation'.

• Mid-Sem Examination (10%)

This is a written test conducted in the middle of the semester after completion of 30% to 40% of the course. 10% marks are allotted for Mid-Sem Examination.

Attendance (5%)

Ideally, a student is expected to attend 100% of the classes, but considering various hindrances like illness, accident, etc. a relaxation of maximum 25% is given, which means a student has to maintain an attendance of minimum 75% in each subject. To reward and encourage higher attendance, 1-5 marks

are given to students having more than 75% attendance, as per the following connotation:



2. The Semester End Examination (SEE) carries a weightage of 70%, and is conducted usually in May-June and December-January for Odd and Even Semester respectively for all papers of a particular course. Based on prescribed course structure, the nature of examination may vary for theoretical and practical papers.

7.2 Mentor-Mentee System

7.2.1 Objectives of the Mentor-Mentee System are:

- To help the students understand the culture, opportunities and challenges present in the University and have a smooth transition to campus life;
- To help students cope with their academic, co-curricular and personal issues for a balanced and healthy growth;

4. Fotophile - The objective of the Photography club is to hone the photographic skills of the students that would turn their taste of photography into a passion and groom them to be quality photographers.

5. Sports Club - The sports club has been instituted to inculcate sports culture among students by organising sports activities and to succor the students develop vital skills needed in sports such as leadership, team spirit, responsibility, self-discipline etc. and how to maintain positive peer relations amongst all with an aim to enhance the level of performances.
