Executive Summary



The Assam Royal Global University in its second year of existence moves forward with the same zeal and is equally committed to its goal for excellence. This belief is grounded on the fact that 1158 students enrolled themselves in the undergraduate, postgraduate and Ph.D. programmes this academic year. The University currently consists of 1762 students across its 21 schools and 64 programmes. It is also worth mentioning that the Royal School of Engineering & Technology ranked as No. 1 Engineering college in Assam and also amongst promising Engineering colleges in India by Competition Success Review-Global Human Resource Development Centre (Engineering College Survey 2019). The Royal School of Business on the other hand has been ranked among 'Top promising B-Schools in India' by Competition Success Review-GHRDC B-School Survey 2019.

The role of research in an academic institution is significant for its sustainability and development, and it is imperative to have knowledge-driven growth based on innovation. In order to promote research in the University as well as to encourage the students towards a research-oriented approach, the Royal Centre for Research Publication Patents & Projects (RCRPPP) has been constituted with a separate cell for projects and consultancy named Royal Research and Development Cell (RRDC). The Royal Centre for Act East Policy (RCAEP) and The Royal Centre for Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Tie-Ups (RCIET) were also constituted with the aim to foster a vibrant ecosystem for the creation and growth of knowledge and research-driven enterprises. Within a year the University has been able to strengthen its academic hold by signing MOUs with institutions like IIT-Guwahati, Institute of Advanced Study in Science & Technology, M/S ICA Edu Skills Pvt. Ltd among many others.

Apart from the state-of-the-art infrastructure, the University has 118 well equipped Labs to support its research endeavours. The University library has a rich collection of 8,358 titles and 24,222 volumes of printed books, 12359 e-books, and 15354 e-journals. The database for the entire collection can be accessed through Online Public Access Catalogue (WebOPAC) making the materials easily accessible. The University, to support the brilliant students and acknowledge their hard work offers the Royal Merit Scholarship and the Royal Endowment Scholarship distributed across various categories. Further, the University also recognizes students (final year) showing academic excellence and discipline, through the Dean's List award. In order to motivate the students, the University in this academic year also hosted a number of interactive sessions with several dignitaries such as Dr. Subramaniam Swamy, 'Forest Man of India' Mr. Jadav Payeng and 'Dhing Express' Hima Das to name a few.

The University truly believes in the necessity of keeping the campus environment vibrant with events of cultural significance that provide the students with an opportunity to showcase their several talents. 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1. An Overview

The Assam Royal Global University (RGU), a State Private University, established by The Assam Royal Global University Act 2013, notified by the Government of Assam Gazette on 20/08/2013, started its first academic session from July 2017. The University is located in Betkuchi, National Highway 37, and spans across 37,000 square meters [4 lakh square feet] of built-up centrally air-conditioned structures. During this academic year, the total numbers of courses offered were increased to 81 under 21 schools from 55 courses under 13 schools.

- MoU was signed between M/S ICA Edu Skills Pvt. Ltd and RGU on 21st January 2019. It is a joint academic programme through which students would get an exposure to a specifically designed & customised curriculum and extensive internship opportunities.
- MoU was signed between Institute of Advanced Study in Science & Technology (IASST) and RGU on 14 March 2019 with the aim of facilitating enhancement of teaching, learning & research of students and faculty members of both the Institutions by enabling joint supervision of Ph.D. scholars, faculty exchange, sharing of facility/infrastructure, student exchange for summer/winter training, and jointly organising seminars/symposia/workshops/conferences.

Apart from these MoU, Associations were formed with Vivanta by Taj on August 2, 2018, and with Radisson Blu, Guwahati, on August 23, 2018, for practical exposure of students of BHM and TTM in the infrastructural facility of the hotels.

1.7 University Infrastructure

The RGU campus is more than 27 acres of land and about 12 lakh square feet built up centrally air-conditioned area available for running various courses of Royal Global University. RGU is the Number.1 private university in Northeast with world-class infrastructure, cultural events, campus recruitment programmes and activities, expert students, and updated facilities. It is facilitated with amphitheatre style classrooms centrally air-conditioned with Wi-Fi facilities, central library, hostels for both boys and girls, seminar halls, Colloquium, computer centre, infirmary, playground, cafeteria, visitors lounge, Conference room, BOG room, Common room, Studios, Computer centre and 85+ high tech labs like physics, chemistry, pharmacy, nursing lab etc. Royal Global University comprises of experienced educationists from elite Institutions and Universities of national and international repute. Every faculty provides extra attention and care to every student (maintaining 1:15 teacher-student ratio and 1:1 care too). The University strives to stand apart as one of the best private universities in the region with many cutting-edge advantages for its students like exposure to research-driven curriculum, regular hands-on practical experiences related to curriculum, choice-based-credit system of pursuance of choice of study, value-based education, holistic physical and mental wellness development programmes, student-exchange programmes and many more to add to one's basket of professional grooming.

Facilities

• Library Facilities

The library of RGU is spread over 8000 square feet. The spacious high-tech, well furnished, centrally air-conditioned, duplex modern library of RGU is like an integrated resource centre that is stocked with rich collection of advanced books in different functional areas of management, engineering, architecture, nursing, physiotherapy, sociology, psychology and other courses. The library facilities and services include regular subscription to national and international journals, electronics journals, round-the-clock accessibility, photocopy and CD-rewriting etc. The library provides excellent information services and resources to the participants of various programs, research scholars, faculty members and also the wider community to enable them to become knowledge hunters.

• Hostel

The Assam Royal Global University provides its hostel boarders with all the comforts of one's home. It is beautifully situated in the midst of an eco-friendly and green campus. The separate in-campus hostels Aditya House (Boy's hostel) and Harsha House (Girl's hostel) are equipped with adequate facilities for a holistic mental and physical growth. The hostel environment will help each boarder get the most of their time during the period of stay. Centrally air conditioned, the hostel rooms are laid out in beautiful cluster offering plenty of buddy time. It has 24 hour electricity, water supply and internet which make the environment in the hostel conducive for living and learning. Other facilities include Gymnasium, TV sets in each cluster, two/three bedded rooms, lifts, round the clock infirmary and medical help, in-suite bathroom, comfortable study area, storage racks for books and belongings etc. An experienced warden takes on the role of the guardian for all the boarders of the RGU hostel. The best part of the location of the hostels is that they are located within easy reach of the academic buildings which facilitates frequent interaction with the faculties even during periods of vacation and on holidays.

• Sports

The University proudly boasts of its international standard indoor sports complex "The Cube" offering variety of indoor games including badminton courts, squash, billiards, table tennis etc. The University also has facilities for outdoor games like Football, Lawn Tennis, Cricket, Basketball, Baseball etc. Fitness conscious students can go for a jog around the scenic university campus or work out at gymnasium which has equipments for stretching, floor and bodybuilding exercises like tread mills, dumbbells and plates, weights, shoulder press, leg-pull, leg extension, incline shoulder, double twisters etc.



- **Health care**

At The Assam Royal Global University, our prime focus is on good health of our students. Infirmaries manned by ward girls under the guidance of qualified on call doctors are available twenty four hours a day. In addition to attending to the medical needs of the students in the campus, the doctors also carry out periodic medical check-up of the students. A well-equipped ambulance is also available 24x7 for the students in case of emergency. The university also has tie-up with an exclusive city-based multispecialty hospital.

- **Campus Security**

High boundary walls and round-the-clock well trained security guards patrolling the area 24x7 make the campus safe and secure. CCTV cameras, fire alarm, anti-ragging squad further add to the safety of our students and staff. No one can enter and leave the campus without proper authorization which is verified at various levels.

- **Transport**

The University runs a fleet of very comfortable air-conditioned buses for pick and drop of our students and staff from different corners of the city. The fleet of buses is taken care of by the transport-in-charge who in turn is responsible for a team of well-behaved drivers and helpers.

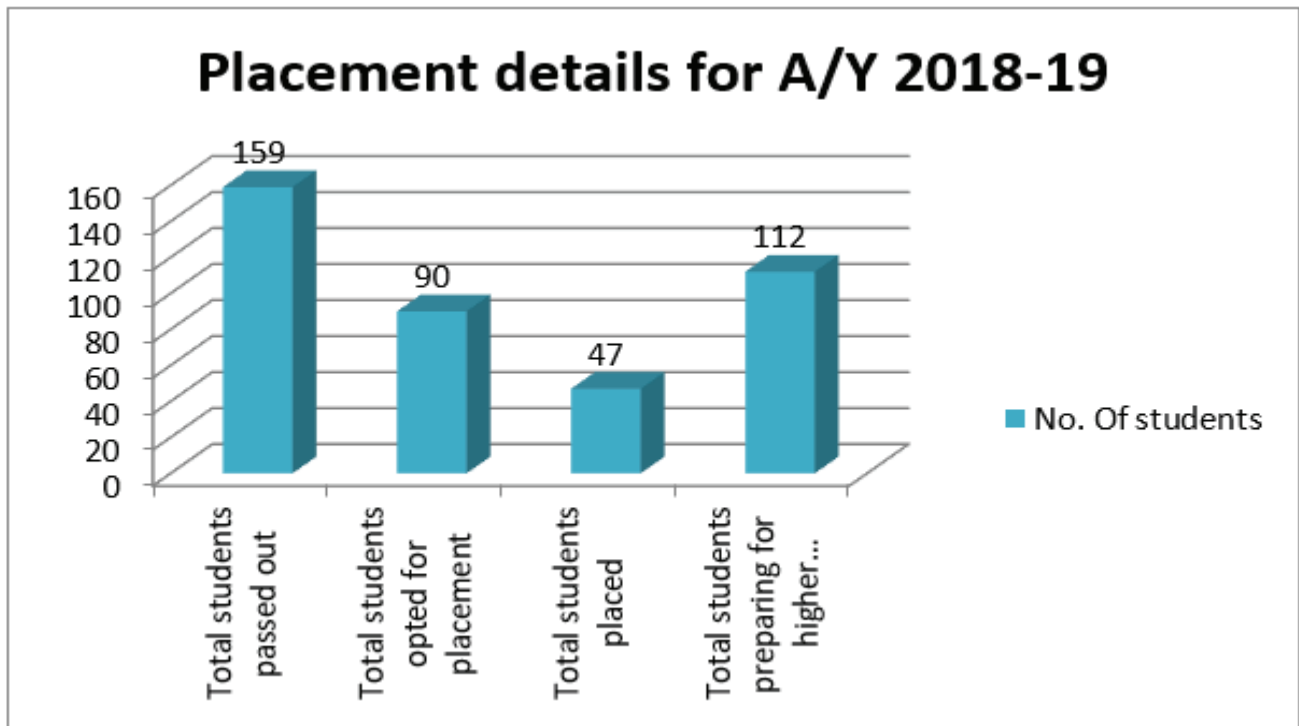


Fig : Placement details for A/Y 2018-19

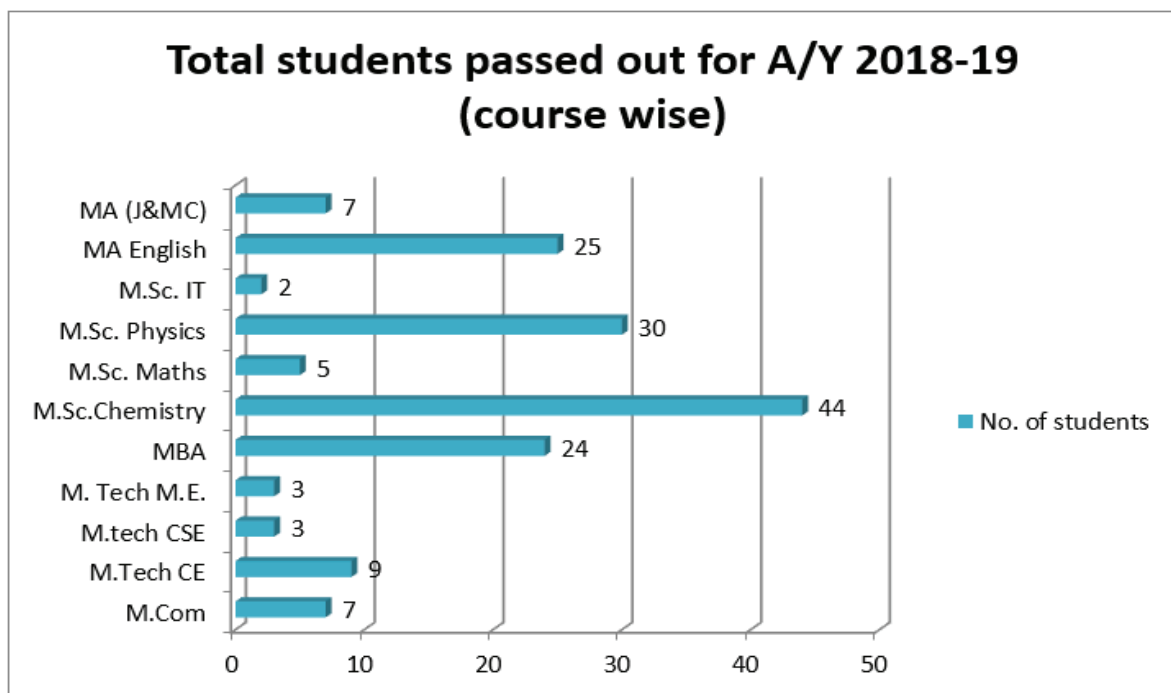


Fig : Total number of students passed out from departments requiring placement assistance for A/Y 2018-19

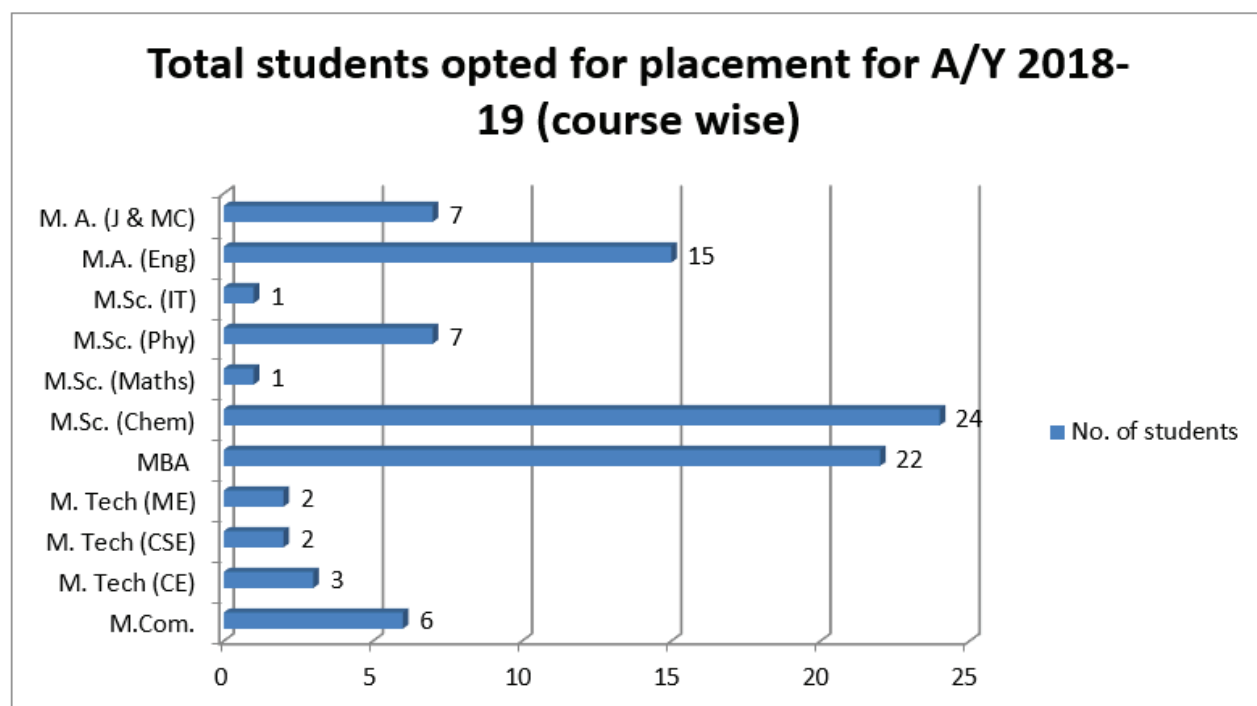


Fig : Total students opted for placement for A/Y 2018-19 (course wise)

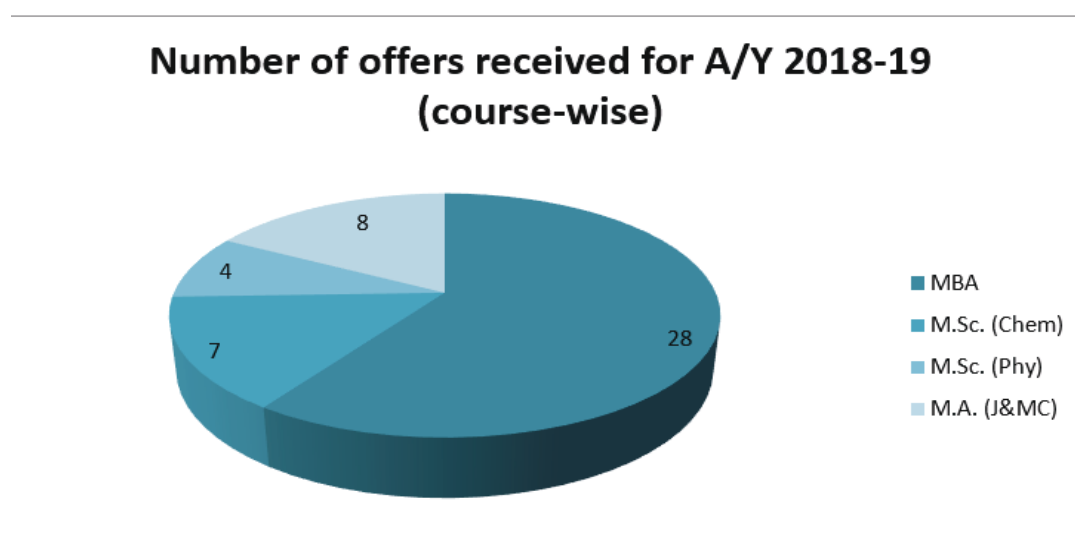


Fig : Placement offers for A/Y 2018-19 (Course wise)

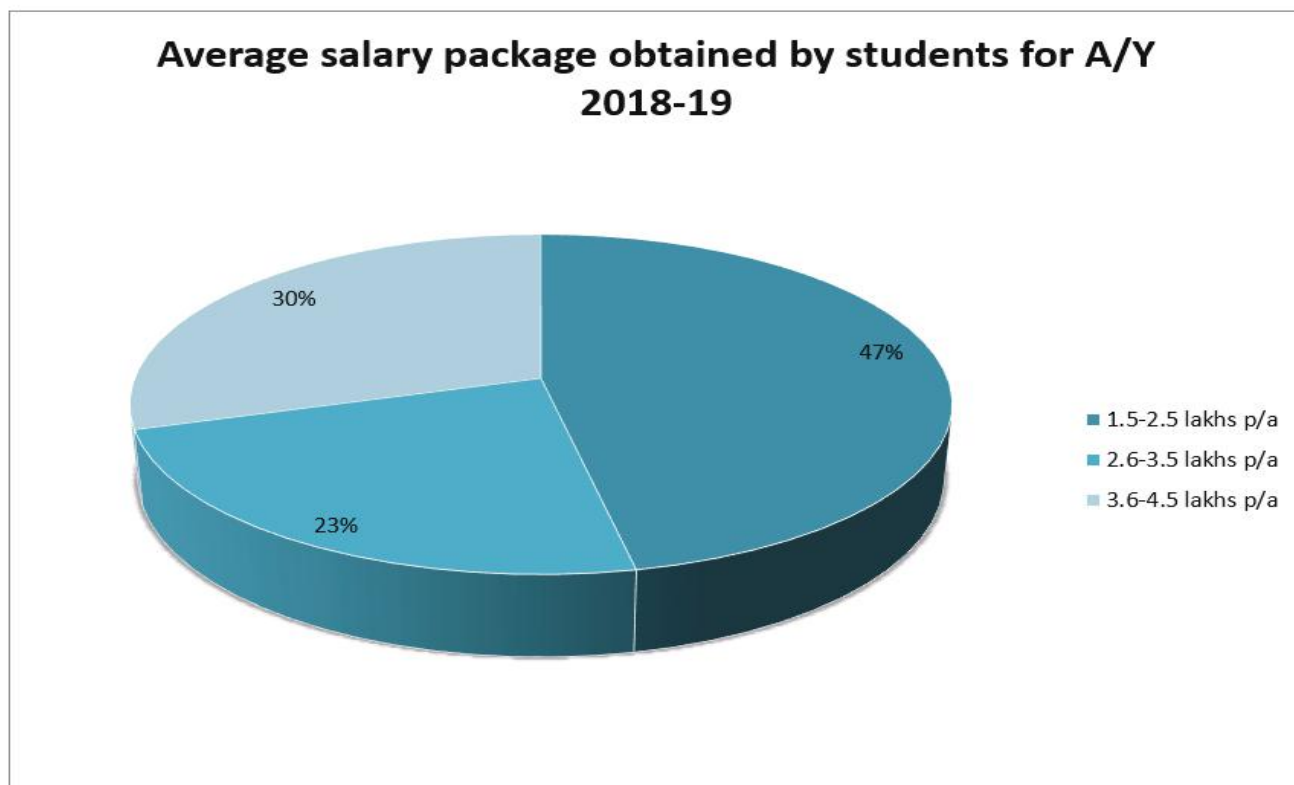


Fig : Average salary package for A/Y 2018-19

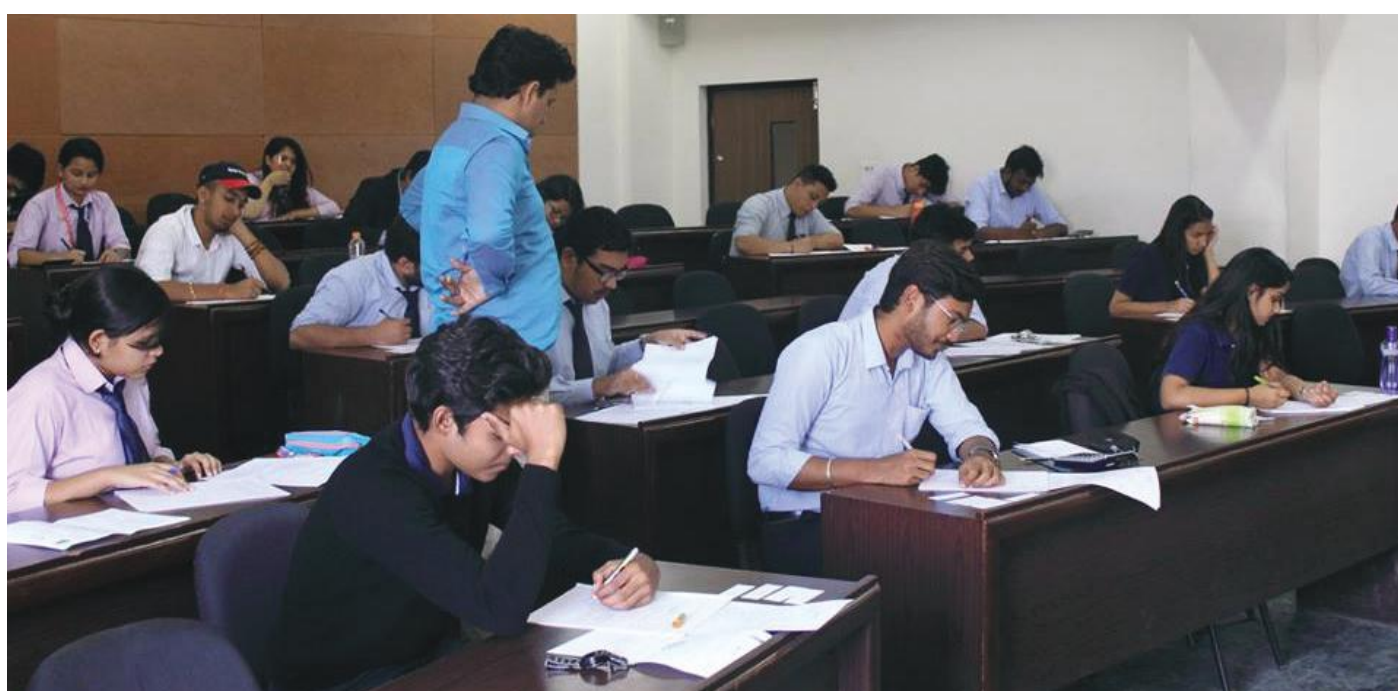

6. Library

Spread over 743 square meters (8000 square feet), the Central Library of RGU is a well-furnished, centrally air-conditioned, duplex-type library. Situated on the first and second floors of B block, the library is a hub for academic queries and research activities. The library is fully computerized and provides essential information on knowledge related to engineering, management, architecture, law, commerce, fashion, fine arts, etc. The total collection stands at 8,358 titles and 24,222 volumes of printed books, 12359 e-books, 2 printed and 15354 e-journals. The database for the entire collection can be accessed through Online Public Access Catalogue (WebOPAC). Apart from this, the library holds special collection on North-East, competitive and fiction/non-fiction corners. The library subscribes to eight daily newspapers and a number of reputed magazines. The library management is done by ILMS SOUL 2.0 server platform and barcode system (Jan, 2013). As a member of DELNET, the library avails various facilities of member institutions through resource sharing, on demand from the users, as and when required. It provides ready reference service like Content List Service, using both offline and online sources of information to the users. Similarly, the university also subscribes to Manupatra and other online legal data bases through which national and International judgements and also journals can be accessed.

Overall Ph. D. Coursework Result for AY 2018-19

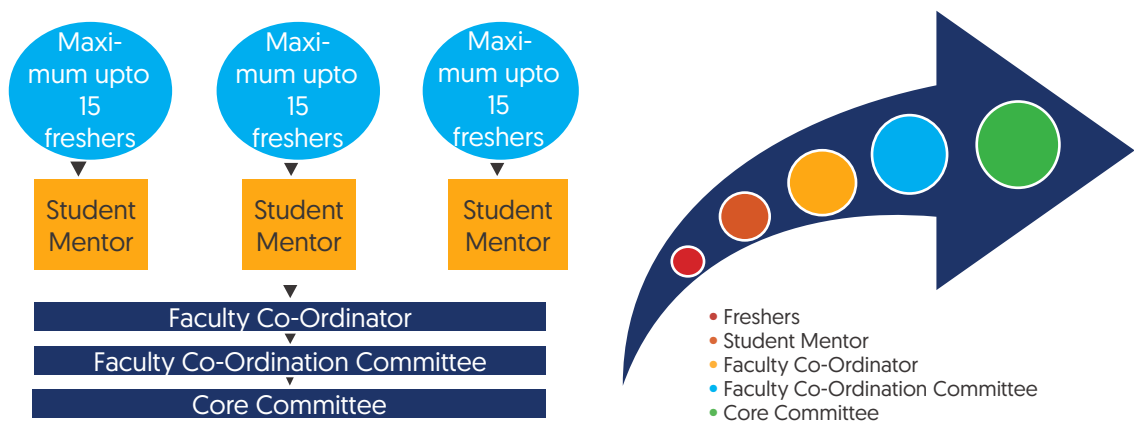


7.2 Mentor-Mentee System

Sports Club - The sports club has been instituted to inculcate sports culture among students by organising sports activities and to help the students develop vital skills needed in sports such as leadership, team spirit, responsibility, self-discipline etc. and how to maintain positive peer relations amongst all with an aim to enhance the level of performances.

6. Royal Commerce Club - The club was established under the administration of Royal School of Commerce. The activities of the club focus on practical training of the knowledge the students gain in the classroom. One of its main objectives is to expose students to meet the practical challenges in the current business scenario.

7.4 Dean's List

Dean's List is a List of Honour, which comprises of only final year students who have shown academic excellence and discipline, during their course of study in the University, till pre-final year. The Dean's List award is not a scholarship as it does not come with any financial aid. This Award is a recognition which will elevate students to higher echelons of success. The awardee (student) will receive a personalized letter of appreciation from the University officers viz. Dean Academics/Vice-Chancellor to honour and recognize their excellent performance.

This award is instituted school wise, irrespective of the course of study, for pre-final year students. Separate Dean's List shall be made for UG & PG levels. The selection of students for this list will be done after the end of every academic year, for pre-final year students, based on results of all the previous semesters, attendance etc.

A maximum of 05 students are nominated per school, and the minimum eligibility criteria to qualify for the Dean's list are,

1. Cumulative ninety percent (90%) attendance in both theory and practical classes for last two semesters, along with minimum attendance of eighty-five (85%) percent in all the previous semesters, considered for award.
2. High Grades in academic performance.
