## **COMMUNIQUE OF CHANCELLOR**



# **Executive Summary**



The Annual Report AY 2020-21 comes at a time when the world is severely paralysed with the global outbreak of the Coronavirus pandemic. In the midst of all the uncertainties, The Assam Royal Global University has kept its momentum to strive to do better every single day, keeping the light of optimism shining. Keeping pace with the circumstances of the working environment where the world shifted to the work-from-home mode, even The Assam Royal Global University swiftly shifted to this mode and ran all official functions and duties from the homes of the efficient team members it is made up of – the Management, the teaching staff and the non-teaching staff. As a result of institutional growth and academic maturity, RGU now offers 90 courses with integrated courses in 11 programmes under 25 schools and 9 faculty of studies.

The third Annual Report of RGU takes an introspective look at three main areas of focus-Academic Excellence, Institutional Growth, and Partnership. The executive summary will provide a transparent snapshot of the growth Royal Global University has successfully accomplished in the past twelve months. The report also shows areas where the university needs to put in more effort to add uniformity in growth and thus strengthen the development.

## **Academic Excellence**

The Assam Royal Global University launched new programs at various credential levels, with a focus on cross-disciplinary learning, in emerging sectors and high-demand sectors. The year also saw the initial preparatory phase for submission of RGU SSR for NAAC.

To strengthen the research and development of the university, the faculty team has always been encouraged to work towards submission of research/ project proposals to funding agencies. Out of a total of seven project proposals submitted in the last three years, RGU has received the approval of two projects namely Energy Auditing of Tea Estates of Assam (McLeod Russel-Monabarie Tea Estate and Amchong Tea Estate ) followed by technical advice and training on energy saving audit data analysis and report generation, submitted by Department of Electrical Engineering, RGU; and IOT Based SOS system for detecting Accident with a two-wheeler vehicle – submitted by Department of Computer Science and Engineering. The two projects have been funded by Collaborative Research Scheme of ASTU under TEQUIP-III program of MHRD funded by World Bank and Assam Science Technology & Environment Council respectively.

A good number of 192 research publications inclusive of research papers in journals, conference proceedings and books/chapters, have been added to the repository of the university research and publication division. Ms. Aruna Dev Rroy, Asst. Prof. Royal School of Commerce, published the book titled Marketing Management: A Prologue. Dr. Debajit Borah, Assistant Professor of Biotechnology, RGU, and Mr. Abhijit Sonowal, alumni of the same department were jointly awarded 'BRIC's Idea Exposition Award' on the theme entitled "Innovations in Agriculture and Sustainability" organized by DBT-BIRAC Regional Innovation Centre (BRIC) in collaboration with Idea Knowledge Park, Hyderabad, and IIT-Guwahati Biotech Park, Guwahati during July 16-17, 2020. Ms. Sumi Kankana Dewan, Assistant Professor, Dept. of ECE, RSET, designed a ZnO nanoparticle based Biosensing device for detecting four biological parameters for diagnosing the heath of liver and kidney of animals and birds, and has been encouraged to go ahead for filing of patent. Adding further to the research and innovation, the faculty team along with the students are actively involved in innovation by successfully designing devices beneficial for protection of health workers in hospitals and other institutions. Dr. Niraj Singh, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Microbiology, Royal School of Bio-Sciences was conferred with "Young Plant Pathologist Award" in International Web-Conference on "New Trends in Agriculture, Environmental & Biological Sciences for Inclusive Development (NTAEBSID-2020)". He also received the Hayward-Prior Travel Award 2020 in 7th International Bacterial Wilt Symposium held in Montevideo, Uruguay, from 29th March to 3rd April 2020 (event postponed to 2021 due to covid 19). The Institution Innovation Cell (IIC) of RGU, founded in October 2019, initiated by the MHRD Innovation Cell, manufactured head shields, using the 3D printer technology, and donated them to Excelcare Pediatric Department.

RGU continued to advance experiential learning opportunities for students through the use of advanced teaching-learning tools and has witnessed a considerable result in the annual examination results. The annual pass percentage has stood at 95%. Also, altogether 55 students are enrolled under the nine categories of scholarship schemes offered by the university. To motivate students to shine better in their academic pursuits, Royal Global University felicitated the twenty students who cleared UGC - NET and Assam-TET examinations for December 2019.

Students of the university earned laurels in several national level competitions for their innovations. Rishab Goenka, students of Royal School of Architecture won the silver medal in International Essay competition conducted by Heartfulness, 2020. Ms. Nargis Zaman and Mr. Saklain Mustak Alam,

students of Department of Botany were selected for summer internships with CSIR in National Botanical Research Institute, Lucknow. Mr. Mebanshan Shadap of Royal School of Business bagged silver(1st runner up) for Western Instrumental (solo) and Ms. Priyanka Dey of Royal School of Humanities and Social Sciences won bronze (2nd runner up) in the category of Light Vocal Indian (solo) in the 35 Inter University National Youth Festival held at Amity University, Noida.

Going by the vision of RGU in creating global citizens, the University has taken every step to expose the students to different socio-cultural perspectives of life. The University saw the celebration of important days like Matribhasha Diwas, Jyoti Diwas, Silpi Diwas, Consensio 2020 (the annual youth festival of RGU) etc, along with a lot of awareness programmes conducted by all the departments. Another medal of honour was bestowed on RGU when the Association of Indian Universities showed its faith by entrusting RGU with the 35th East Zone Inter University National Youth Festival, which was aptly called Karmotsav. The Department of Social Work adopted the DeuChutal village at Pamohi, Kamrup, Assam. On the occasion of the birth anniversary of Bharat Ratna Dr. A.P.J Abdul Kalam, 'Innovation Day' was celebrated with spot slogan writing, "Innovative Idea contest", followed by presentation of students on "National Start-up Policy". Many awareness programmes like Covid, Drug abuse, Breast cancer, leprosy, Swacchata hi Seva; and donation drives were also instituted by the various departments of the university.

## **Institutional Growth**

The year 2019-20 has been a year of upward growth with the increase in numbers in admission, recruitment, research and publication, MoUs signed and others. Noteworthy to mention, the new academic block was inaugurated on 27 August 2019 by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Assam, Sri Sarbananda-Sonowal. A contribution of Rs. Five Lakhs was also extended towards the Chief Minsiter's Relief Fund for Flood Victims of Assam. The contribution was brought forward by the faculty and staff of Royal Global University and Royal Global School by dedicating their one day's salary towards the fund. However, a few areas have also shown a downward trend. Table A shows the areas which have witnessed an increase in the numbers and Table B reflects the comparative figures of the areas showing a decrease in the numbers or have remained the same.

# **Partnership**

RGU continues to build on academic and industry partnerships to enrich work and learning experiences for our students. Significant progress has been made on various sectors with foundation operational plans for 2020-2021 completed and a shared procurement process now established. The Assam Royal Global University (RGU), a State Private University, established by The Assam Royal Global University Act 2013, notified by the Government of Assam Gazette on 20/08/2013, is in its 3rd vear of academic excellence offering a total of 117 courses under 24 schools in diverse fields. Established in July 2009 as Royal Group of Institutions, which has now been merged into The Assam Royal Global University, the University is located opposite to Tirupati Balaji Temple on National Highway and spans across 37,000 square meters (4 lakh square feet) of built-up centrally air-conditioned structures.

## 1.7 University Infrastructure

The RGU campus is more than 27 acres of land and about 12 lakh square feet built up centrally air-conditioned area available for running various courses of The Assam Royal Global University. RGU is the Number.1 private university in Northeast with world-class infrastructure, cultural events, campus recruitment programmes and activities, expert students, and updated facilities. It is facilitated with amphitheatre style classrooms centrally air-conditioned with Wi-Fi facilities, central library, hostels for both boys and girls, seminar halls, Colloquium, infirmary, playground, cafeteria, visitors lounge, Conference room, BOG room, Common room, Studios, Computer center and 85+ high tech labs like physics, chemistry, pharmacy, nursing lab etc. The Assam Royal Global University comprises of experienced educationists from elite Institutions and Universities of national and international repute. Every faculty provides extra attention and care to every student (maintaining 1:15 teacher-student ratio and 1:1 care too).

The University strives to stand apart as one of the best private universities in the region with many cutting-edge advantages for its students like exposure to research-driven curriculum, regular hands-on practical experiences related to curriculum, choice-based-credit system of pursuance of choice

of study, value-based education, holistic physical and mental wellness development programmes, student-exchange programmes and many more to add to one's basket of professional grooming.

#### **Facilities**

#### Library Facilities

The library of RGU is spread over 8000 square feet. The spacious high-tech, well furnished, centrally air-conditioned, duplex modern library of RGU is like an integrated resource centre that is stocked with rich collection of advanced books in different functional areas of management, engineering, architecture and other courses. The library facilities and services include regular subscription to national and international journals, electronics journals, round-the-clock accessibility, photocopy and CD-rewriting etc. The library provides excellent information services and resources to the participants of various programs, research scholars, faculty members and also the wider community to enable them to become knowledge hunters.

#### Hostel

The Assam Royal Global University provides its hostel boarders with all the comforts of one's home. It is beautifully situated in the midst of an eco-friendly and green campus. The separate in-campus hostels Aditya House (Boy's hostel) and Harsha House (Girl's hostel) are equipped with adequate facilities for a holistic mental and physical growth. The hostel environment will help each boarder get the most of their time during the period of stay. Centrally air conditioned, the hostel rooms are laid out in beautiful cluster offering plenty of buddy time. It has 24 hour electricity, water supply and internet which make the environment in the hostel conducive for living and learning. Other facilities include Gymnasium, TV sets in each cluster, two/three bedded rooms, lifts, round-the-clock infirmary and medical help, in-suite bathroom, comfortable study area, storage racks for books and belongings etc. An experienced warden takes on the role of the guardian for all the boarders of the RGU hostel. The best part of the location of the hostels is that they are located within easy reach of the academic buildings which facilitates frequent interaction with the faculties even during periods of vacation and on holidays.

#### • Sports

The University proudly boasts of its international standard indoor sports complex "The Cube" offering variety of indoor games including badminton courts, squash, billiards, table tennis etc. The University also has facilities for outdoor games like Football, Lawn Tennis, Cricket, Basketball, Baseball etc. Fitness conscious students can go for a jog around the scenic university campus or work out at gymnasium which has equipments for stretching, floor and bodybuilding exercises like tread mills, dumbbells and plates, weights, shoulder press, leg-pull, leg extension, incline shoulder, double twisters etc.

#### Health care

At The Assam Royal Global University, our prime focus is on good health of our students. Infirmaries manned by ward girls under the guidance of qualified on call doctors are available twenty four hours a day. In addition to attending to the medical needs of the students in the campus, the doctors also carries out periodic medical check-up of the students. A well-equipped ambulance is also available 24x7 for the students in case of emergency. The university also has tie-up with an exclusive city-based multispecialty hospital 'Excelcare Hospital'.

#### • Campus Security

High boundary walls and round-the-clock well trained security guards patrolling the area 24x7 make the campus safe and secure. CCTV cameras, fire alarm, anti-ragging squad further add to the safety of our students and staff. No one can enter and leave the campus without proper authorization which is verified at various levels.

#### Transport

The University runs a fleet of very comfortable air-conditioned buses for pick and drop of our students and staff from different corners of the city. The fleet of 10 buses is taken care of by the transport-in-charge who in turn is responsible for a team of well-behaved drivers and helpers.

- c) To recommend to the Academic Council, the courses and syllabi of Studies in the various programmes assigned to the school.
- d) To consider schemes for the advancement of the standards of teaching and research, and to submit such proposals to the Academic Council.
- e) To promote and consider schemes for interaction with industry and to submit such proposals to the Academic Council/ Vice-Chancellor.
- f) To prepare and formulate schemes for faculty development and to submit such proposals to Vice-Chancellor/ Academic Council.
- g) To consider feedback reports on the placement and employability of the passed out students and to suggest remedial measures wherever necessary for consideration of Vice-Chancellor/ Academic Council.
- h) To consider proposals for revenue generation including professional consultancies, resource sharing etc. and submit such proposals to Vice-Chancellor.

# Activities (AY 2020-21)

- Faculty Colloquium (Faculty Seminar Series)
  - \* Faculty Colloquium (Oct-Dec, 2020): It was the fifth consecutive seminar of its kind, conducted by HRDC, RGU. This was organized from 17 Oct, 2020 to 12 Dec, 2020. The presenters were faculty members from all departments/schools of RGU. Considering the prevailing situation of COVID-19 pandemic, the sessions were conducted through digital platforms. In view of the on-going phase, the sessions were all conducted through online mode (three parallel sessions). However, a common platform was shared on the first day. The sessions were held on every Saturday from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm. The timing had been chosen in such
  - \* a way that maximum number of faculty could participate in the seminar. The Faculty

\* Colloquium started with an inaugural session on 5th June 2021, followed by presentations. This seminar encourages faculty members of the university to present their domain expertise on a common platform. Content of presentations included extensive range of topics, variety of inputs, and practical information from different schools of RGU. Most of the presenters presented their original works while some of them presented review works. In total, there was 17 (seventeen) days of deliberations (05.06.2021 to 11.12.2021) with three parallel sessions at three different online platforms. We were able to conduct Faculty Colloquium, 2021 successfully with more than 200 participations.

Faculty Colloquium showcases the commitment of our University to motivate research culture among various disciplines. This seminar also helps in bridging the gap between academia and industries for overall societal development.

### 3.11 Royal Publication Cell (RPC)







In the above Fig. it is seen that out of the total number of 64 recruiters who had come for the recruitment of RGU students from different sectors, IT Services and Education sector saw the highest number of recruiters in the AY 2020-21. However, manufacturing organizations as well as Financial consultants also showed keen interest in hiring students from the different schools of the University.



The above figure signifies that major recruiters offered a salary package in the range of 3-6 Lac/annum. However, there were four multinational companies who offered a salary package of more than 6 lac/annum to the students.



The above figure shows that students from MBA as well as Computer Science followed by M.Sc Physics were mostly keen towards recruitment opportunities provided by the University. However, few students from different course/ department too had participated in the placement activities/recruitment processes offered by the University placement department.



The above figure shows that maximum offers were received by students from Management and B.Tech Computer Science & Engineering. The previous graph had confirmed that the number of students opting for placements were also the highest in the above mentioned course/programs. Students from other courses including Civil engineering, B.Com, M.Sc Chemistry etc. too have received offers from various reputed organizations of the country.successfully placed students of RSET, RSB, RSC and RSA in lucrative industrial positions.

### **3.17 University Proctorial Board (UPB)**

The University Proctorial Board (UPB) of The Assam Royal Global University (RGU) has 2 Joint Chief Proctors and 24 Proctors to ensure that the students of the University strictly adhere to the rules and regulations framed by the authorities from time to time. The UPB is under the regular guidance and supervision of the Registrar and the Vice-Chancellor of the University. The UPB comes into action only when the respective Schools/ Departments find it difficult to handle or solve students' cases of indiscipline, misconduct etc. In 2018 – 2019, 14 cases related to students' indiscipline or misconduct were handled by the UPB, and in 2019- 2020, the number of cases were 18. Apart from these 32 cases, there have been many other instances where the UPB intervened and resolved issues. It also provides counseling sessions to students and guardians as and when required.

The prudence and persistence of the UPB has been able to create an atmosphere of discipline and order in the minds of all students of RGU, including hostellers. The UPB earnestly hopes that with advice and support from all quarters, it will definitely be able to transform RGU campus into one of the most disciplined university campuses in the country.

### 3.18 Institution's Innovation Council – Assam Royal Global University (IIC-RGU)

## 6. Library

Spread over 743 square meter (8000 square feet), the Central Library of RGU is a well-furnished, centrally air-conditioned, duplex-type library. Situated in first and second floors of B block, the library is a hub for academic queries and research activities. The library is fully computerized and provides essential information on knowledge related to engineering, management, architecture, law, commerce, fashion, fine arts, etc. The total collection stands at 9382 titles and 26859 volumes of printed books,



13042 e-books, 3 printed and 6460 e-journals/e-articles. The various e-resources available include e-journals, ebooks and e-databases under different areas. The database for the entire collection can be accessed through Online Public Access Catalogue (Web OPAC). Apart from this, the library holds special collection on North-East, competitive and fiction/non-fiction corners. The library subscribes to 3 daily newspapers and a number of reputed magazines. The library management is done by ILMS SOUL 3.0 server platform and barcode system (Jan 2013). As a member of DELNET, the library avails various facilities of member institutions through resource sharing, on demand from the users, as and when required. It provides ready reference service like Content List Service, using both offline and online sources of information to the users. Similarly, the university also subscribes to MANUPATRA the legal e-data base which national and international judgements and journals can be accessed.




### 7.2 Mentor-Mentee System

### 7.3 Co-curricular activities and Clubs

### 7.4 Dean's List

Dean's List is a List of Honour, which comprises of only final year students who have shown academic excellence and discipline, during their course of study in the University, till pre-final year. The Dean's List award is not a scholarship as it does not come with any financial aid. This Award is a recognition which will elevate students to higher echelons of success. The awardee (student) will receive a personalized letter of appreciation from the University officers viz. Dean Academics/Vice-Chancellor to honour and recognize their excellent performance.

This award is instituted school wise, irrespective of the course of study, for pre-final year students. Separate Dean's List shall be made for UG & PG levels. The selection of students for this list will be done after the end of every academic year, for pre-final year students, based on results of all the previous semesters, attendance etc.

A maximum of 05 students are nominated per school, and the minimum eligibility criteria to qualify for the Dean's list are.

- 1. Cumulative ninety percent (90%) attendance in both theory and practical classes for last two semesters, along with minimum attendance of eighty-five (85%) percent in all the previous semesters, considered for award.
- 2. High Grades in academic performance.
