

Our focus in the year ahead will be on formulating and perfecting our educational strategies, implementation of latest technology-oriented classrooms, and the harmony between our teaching and research missions. Plans are well advanced across campus for enhancements of our information technology (IT) infrastructure, new state-of-the-art teaching and research facilities, and other initiatives solely focused on benefitting the students and making a social impact.

3. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY BY THE VICE-CHANCELLOR



Reflecting upon the major developments of the academic year August 2022 to July 2023, this Annual Report takes stock of the progress made by the university in this time frame with reference to student records as well as architectural growth, academic accolades and policy frameworks. An integral part of the University's efforts in the aftermath of the online education phase has been to facilitate the students in relearning classroom etiquettes and in their resuming a regularity of the uniform life. As we have all adapted in numerous ways to live in this post-Covid world, it is my pleasure to report that we have been able to build upon the pillars erected by the previous years.

The fifth annual report of The Assam Royal Global University makes an introspective assessment putting three major areas of focus under the lens: Academic Excellence, Institutional Growth, and Partnership. The objective of this account is to reveal to us the potential of growth even as we acknowledge the steady progression. There has been a steady growth in all the areas of the institutional development, mainly research and projects, student enrollment and university events. RGU now offers 130 programs, across 42 departments consisting of undergraduate, postgraduate, integrated, diploma and doctoral degree under 24 schools. The last academic year saw a commendable growth in the campus infrastructure in terms of classroom space, laboratories, instruments, library, sports arena. The university has established an Optometry Lab, Biosciences Research Laboratory, a well equiped Physiotherapy Laboratory and the Royal Diagnostic Lab. Our students have not just performed academically well but have also excelled in sports events of state and national levels. We have been successful in organizing two Inter University Table-Tennis Tournaments—3 Day East Zone Inter University Table-Tennis (Women) Tournament and 3 Day East Zone Inter University Table Tennis (Men) Tournament with more than thirty teams participating from the entire eastern zone. It is a matter of pride that the University attained an NSS Grant amounting to INR 149, 400 from the Office of Sports and Youth Welfare, Government of India.

The University has expanded its collaborative enterprises such as eminent national as well as international educational institutes through MoU's. As on date we have more than 86 MoU's signed for the teaching, research collaboration, student and faculty exchange. In the last year, we joined hands with as many as 29 colleges of Assam, 16 polytechnic institutes, and 12 other national institutes of repute including the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI). We also have signed an MoU with the Sun Moon University of South Korea, thereby furthering the way for international academic collaboration. This year Royal Global University has entered into an MoU with O.P Jindal Global University, under the Institutional Mentorship Agreement to help in curriculum, course outline, global competitive multidisciplinary programs and strenghtening and streamlining of academic and administrative setup.

It is always rewarding when others recognize and appreciate the remarkable work and achievements of our university and its people. It gives me immense pleasure to share that our university has attained 150th rank by the Indian Institute of Ranking Framework (IIRF). We have a robust feedback system owing to which we have been monitoring our quality and continuously striving for progress.

4. Academic Excellence

The year 2022-2023 has been promising in terms of academic growth fueled by an increasing impetus to research and development. Besides publications of repute and a host of academic events like conferences, workshops, faculty development programs, lecture series and webinars, the institute also emphasized upon newer modes of learning through experience and practice. There was a significant increase in outreach programs, educational excursions, field visits and most significantly placement opportunities.

With 24 schools, more than 344 permanent faculty members, 254 doctoral research scholars, 42 Departments and as many as 130 programs and courses, the university has registered a slow but steady growth in academics. University has more than 85 high-end labs which includes inauguration and functioning of 05 new laboratories—Physiotherapy, Microbiology, Biosciences Research Lab, Optometry and Radiology. A few laboratories are in construction phase now and would be functioning soon. These laboratories and work stations boost institutional infrastructure and help train students professionally.

The university takes to its credit in more than 300 publications in reputed books, or national and international journals from faculty members and research scholars across different departments in the last annual year. Of important note is the Royal School of Languages' accomplishment of the release of two ISBN publications, *Spring Orchestra*, an anthology of poems and *Penman's Palette*, an annual magazine. *Spring Orchestra* is a collection of fifty best poems contributed from students across universities for an Inter University Poetry Competition organized by the department.

During this academic session, various project proposals from different departments and schools were submitted to funding organizations like CSIR, DST-SERB, DST amongst others. A total of 26 projects were submitted.

Students of The Assam Royal Global University have made their mark by qualifying in national as well as state competitive examinations like NET, SLET, GATE, APSC, CAT, to mention a few. As on date more than 50 students have achieved professional accolades by clearing these exams. Eight students have been conferred with the Doctoral degree in the annual year and there are more students who are nearing the accomplishment of the degree of the highest order. Noteworthy few among other student achievements are—Barsha Das from the Royal School of Information Technology qualified CAT 2022; Harsh Raj Sharma from the Royal School of Languages, 1 Assam Battalion, NER DTE, bagged the Best Cadet Award in Advanced Leadership Camp held in Rangia; Riya Mishra from Social Work, got through the prestigious Gandhi Fellowship; Hiyaman Kalita and Asif Mondal from Department of Chemistry won the 1st prize in Inter-School Quiz Competition under G20-Y20 Program; and Petrus Baraik from the Royal School of Fine Arts won the second prize in the National Level Art Exhibition and Competition at Yashwantrao Chavan Natyagruha Kaladalan at Pune, organized by Kalamaharshi Baburao Painter Art Foundation.

Events are an integral part of campus life. The year 2022-23 is also remarkable because it is marked by several note-worthy events organized by the university. The Royal Centre of Corporate Relations organized the Biggest Job Fair in the Northeastern Region on 12th of May, 2023, which saw over 125 recruiters and 3500+ registrations. Besides this, the departments of Nursing, Management, Business, and Biosciences came forward with career counselling sessions, industry connect meetings and interview sessions elaborating on career prospects.

The University successfully conducted the Y20 Talks under the aegis of G20 Talks on 6th June, 2023. Eminent personalities- Mr. Mrinal Talukdar, senior journalist and Author; Mrs. Mita Goswami, renowned environmentalist and senior consultant at the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation; and Mr. Vineet Nahata, Director of Power Gilt Treasuries Inc. graced the event.

The University achieved an NSS Grant amounting to INR 149,400 from the Office of Sports and Youth welfare, Govt. of India. There were several sports events and tournaments organized at the university and inter-university levels throughout the year. Two Inter University Table-Tennis Tournaments—3 Day East Zone Inter University Table-Tennis (Women) Tournament and Three Day East Zone Inter University Table Tennis (Men) Tournament with more than thirty teams participating from the entire eastern zone were organized besides intra-university tournaments of Cricket, Football,

Arm wrestling, Carom and Badminton to name a few. Competitions on debate, art, essay writing and quiz also attracted lots of students.

On the academic and research front, many international and national conferences were organized across the university. The International Symposium of South-East Asian Culture was organized on 5th of December by the Cultural Club in association with North East Aashirvad Foundation. Dr. Dayananda Buragohain, former Chairperson AHSEC, was the Chief Guest and other personalities included Dr. Dilip Kakati, Director ABILAC, Govt. of Assam, and, Debojit Khanikar, Joint Secretary, Govt. of Assam, Khagen Sarma, Secretary, North East Aashirvad Foundation. Students and faculty members from Thailand and Guwahati made the event successful.

Several workshops were conducted in the last year. The Department of Computer Science organized a 7 day workshop on Python for Data Analysis, Royal School of Communication and Media organized a workshop on Photography and Cinematography and Royal School of Languages organized the Literary Loom- a workshop on creative writing and poetry among others. The Dye Cult and the Royal Salon d' Spring were remarkable exhibitions displaying the talent of the students of the University. To motivate the students and guide them on career choices, the University organized interactive sessions with two eminent personalities from Assam—Master Chef Winner Nayanjyoti Saikia and UPSC 5th Rank Holder, Mayur Hazarika.

To instill in students a culture of social responsibility, the University witnessed a lot of welfare events in the last year. Department of Physiotherapy organized health camp and offered free screening. A Health Mela was also organized besides Rural Camp, Wildlife Mela, Blood Donation drives, Plantation drive, Donation drive and Cleanliness drive to mark social responsibility. Awareness programs on issues like drugs, child cancer, menstrual hygiene, chemical hazards were important events organized in the last year.



5. Institutional Growth

The year 2022-23 has been a year of resourceful partnerships and collaborations with several industry and academic players. The Assam Royal Global University puts a lot of emphasis on research and development. The university started as a teaching university and is now proud to state that it is gradually emerging as a potential research centre alongside its pedagogical expertise. The University has built a specific centre dedicated to the investigation and development of thought, "The Royal Incubator" focuses on creating an ecosystem of innovation and entrepreneurship development.



7.4 Board of Studies

1. In terms of section 21, Chapter 2, Part C of the First Statutes of the University, read with section 21 (4) of The Assam Private Universities Act, 2007, every School shall have a Board namely, Board of Studies (hereinafter referred to as School Board) consisting of the following members:

Dean of School Chairperson (ex-officio)
 All Heads of Departments Members (ex-officio)
 All Professors Members (ex-officio)

One external expert for each school/department, Members nominated by the Board of Management

Two teachers of the School nominated by the Vice-Chancellor

Registrar or his/her nominee
 Member Secretary (ex-officio)

2. School Board shall be the principal academic body of the School. It shall have the following powers and functions:

- a. To coordinate the teaching and research works in the programmes assigned to the school.
- b. To appoint committees of courses for School's teaching, wherever required, and to supervise the work of such committees.

9. University Infrastructure

The Assam Royal Global University comprises of experienced educationists from elite Institutions and Universities of national and international repute. Every faculty provides extra attention and care to every student (maintaining 1:14 teacher-student ratio and 1:1 care too).

Facilities

9.2 Hostel

The Assam Royal Global University provides its hostel boarders with all the comforts one's home. Situated in the midst of an eco-friendly and green campus, the seperate in-campus hostels Aditya House, NE House (Boy's Hostels) and Harsha House, Samaya House (Girl's Hostels) are equipped with adequate facilities for holistic mental and physical growth of students. 9.3 Sports

The Assam Royal Global University, focuses on the good health of it's students. Infirmaries manned by staff nurses are placed under the guidance of qualified on call doctors are available twenty four hours a day. In addition to attending to the medical needs of the students in the campus. The doctors also carry out periodic medical check-up of the students. A well-equipped ambulance is also available 24×7 for the students in case of emergency. The university has also introduced the 'Royal Swasthya Sewa' under which free healthcare facility including few free medicine is provided from Monday to Friday, 10 to 1 pm.

An Optometry Lab was inaugurated on 29th of December, 2022 in the university premise which also functions as an Eye Clinic, provides a range of eye examination services. The Royal Diagnostic Lab, which was inaugurated on the 27th September, 2022 also, provides a range of services for its students and employees. Another addition into range of healthcare facilities provided in the university campus is a state-of-the-art Radiology Lab which was inaugurated in the campus on 16th June, 2023. This lab is equipped with latest technology and machinery for conduction of various tests and examinations.

9.5 Campus Security

High boundary walls and round-the-clock well trained security guards patrolling the area make the campus safe and secure. CCTV cameras, fire alarm, anti-ragging squad further add to the safety of our students and staff. No one can enter and leave the campus without proper authorisation which is verified at various levels.

The presenters were faculty members from all departments/schools of RGU. The sessions were held on every working day (Monday-Friday & working Saturday) from 4:00 PM to 5:15 PM (offline mode). Considering the growing number of faculty members in different departments, all the schools were allocated into five different groups and accordingly the sessions were conducted in different five venues (parallel sessions). In total, there was 18 (eighteen) days of deliberations.
- » Faculty Colloquium (June-July 2023): It was the eighth consecutive seminar of its kind, conducted by the HRDC, RGU. It was organized from 30 June to 26 July, 2023. The Faculty Colloquium started with an inaugural session on 30 June 2023, followed by presentations. The sessions were conducted in different five venues (parallel sessions). The sessions were held on every working day from 4:00 PM to 5:15 PM. This seminar encourages faculty members of the university to present their domain expertise on a common platform. Content of presentations included extensive range of topics, variety of inputs, and practical information from different schools of RGU. Most of the presenters presented

their original works while some of them presented review works. On an average, there were 17 presentations per day.

The Central Library at RGU spans an area of 743 square meters (equivalent to 8,000 square feet). This modern, well-furnished, centrally air-conditioned duplex library, located on the first and second floors of B block, serves as the academic nucleus for research and knowledge-seeking endeavors.

Our library is at the forefront of technology, fully computerized to provide essential information across a wide spectrum of disciplines, including engineering, management, architecture, law, commerce, fashion, fine arts, and more. Our impressive collection comprises 9,614 titles and 29,407 printed book volumes, as well as 13,042 e-books and access to 6,460 e-journals and e-articles. We offer diverse e-resources, including e-journals, e-books, and e-databases, accessible through our user-friendly Remote Access Software (Remotlog). And also provide an Online Public Access Catalogue (Web OPAC).

In addition to our vast collection, our library boasts special sections dedicated to the Northeast, competitive exam materials, and a fiction/non-fiction corner. We keep our users informed with subscriptions to three daily newspapers and a selection of renowned magazines.

To enhance the efficiency of library operations, we employ ILMS SOUL 3.0 server platform and a barcode system. We are proud members of DELNET, Manupatra, and JSTOR, which allow us to access resources from other institutions, enriching the knowledge landscape for our users. Similarly, the university also subscribes to MANUPATRA the legal e-Data base which national and international judgements and journals can be accessed.



16.2.1 Objectives of the Mentor-Mentee System are:


- To help the students understand the culture, opportunities and challenges present in the University and have a smooth transition to campus life;

There is a well maintained squash court in the Indoor sports complex and the squash tournament is open for all the people in the campus.

16.4 Dean's Lister

Dean's Lister is a List of Honor, which comprises of only final year students who have shown academic excellence and discipline, during their course of study in the University, till pre-final year. The Dean's List award is not a scholarship as it does not come with any financial aid. This Award is a recognition which will elevate students to higher echelons of success. The awardee (student) will receive a personalized letter of appreciation from the University officers, viz. Dean Academics/Vice-Chancellor to honor and recognize their excellent performance.

This award is instituted school wise, irrespective of the course of study, for pre-final year students. Separate Dean's List shall be made for UG & PG levels. The selection of students for this list will be done after the end of every academic year, for pre-final year students, based on results of all the previous semesters, attendance etc.

A maximum of 05 students are nominated per school, and the minimum eligibility criteria to qualify for the Dean's list are,

- a. Cumulative ninety percent (90%) attendance in both theory and practical classes for last two semesters, along with minimum attendance of eighty-five (85%) percent in all the previous semesters, considered for award.
- b. High Grades in academic performance.
- c. Consistently good and exemplary behavior and proficiency in extra-curricular activities.
