


Introduction

One of the foundational pillars of The Assam Royal Global University is its advocacy and promotion of teaching learning processes sans pareil. The University encourages the adoption of a relevant, flexible, and competent curriculum across all programmes, offered by the different departments and schools. With this objective in view, the University has employed the modus operandi of feedback collection from the different stakeholders of the University: faculty members, students, parents, leaders of academia and industry; analysis of the survey reports and implementation of the findings and recommendations. Recently, RGU has undergone a major curriculum revamp to be in line with NEP 2020 objectives and guidelines. Prior to the curriculum revamp, the University had organized a Curriculum Conclave to deliberate upon feedback from different stakeholders-Students, Alumni, Teachers, Parents, Employers and Academic Peers, on curriculum design and frame a broad structure and scheme of all programmes.



The process of curriculum development for various programs starts with the assessment of the existing curriculum taking into consideration requirements of students, skills demanded by industry and job placements. The curriculum inspection comprises of information regarding syllabus planning and holistic experience about the programme. Online feedback about the curriculum is taken from the students using google forms prior to the end of semester. Feedback thus received is duly considered during the review process of curriculum.



The objective of this feedback is to ensure that every student has access to competent and qualitative teaching which leads to vibrant academic, social and personal growth. The IQAC regularly monitors the activity along with other quality initiatives. We need to continuously incorporate such Quality Initiatives in our systems and follow them in letter and spirit for satisfaction of the stakeholders.


Students Feedback on Curriculum

1. Overall Curriculum and Syllabi



This question intends to understand the degree of students' satisfaction on curriculum offered. The responses are- 14.45% students regarded the syllabus of the university as excellent, 35.25% regarded it as very good and 40.33% regarded it as good. Only 2.12% students are not satisfied with it. The Average score of this question is 3.50.

2. The credits and contact hours of courses offered are balanced



This question intends to know about degree of students' satisfaction on the credits and contact hours of courses offered are balanced. The response is- 16.14% students regarded it as excellent, 33.98% regarded it as very good and 41.66% regarded it as good. Only 2.24% students are not satisfied with it. The Average score of this question is 3.56.

3. The course outcomes are well defined and clear




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

The Average score of this question is 3.59.

4. Effective use of teaching aids and ICT to facilitate teaching.





The response is-15.11% students regarded it as excellent, 33.74% regarded it as very good and 42.26% regarded it as good. Only 3.02% students are not satisfied with it. The Average score of this question is 3.53.

5. The courses in curriculum emphasize on inculcating management & entrepreneurship skills

The response is- 15.42% students regarded it as excellent, 46.31% regarded it as very good and 29.56% regarded it as good. Only 2.90% students are not satisfied with it. The Average score of this question is 3.66.

6. A flexible scheme provides the choice based learning to the students





7. Scope and encouragement for Research Activities





The response is- 15.66% of students regarded it as excellent, 35.79% regarded it as very good and 39.90% regarded it as good. Only 2.90% students are not satisfied with it. The Average score of this question is 3.48.

The response is- 23.88% of students regarded it as excellent, 35.73% regarded it as very good and 35.73% regarded it as good. Only 1.33% students are not satisfied with it. The Average score of this question is 3.78.

The response is- 17.47% students regarded it as excellent, 37.55% regarded it as very good and 32.35% regarded it as good. Only 1.69% students are not satisfied with it. The Average score of this question is 3.66.

10. Curriculum helps in bridging the gap between industry and academic institution

The response is- 16.51% students regarded it as excellent, 32.47% regarded it as very good and 40.27% regarded it as good. Only 3.08% students are not satisfied with it. The Average score of this question is 3.51.

2. The course is well- organized and career oriented




This question intends to know about the degree of satisfaction of Alumni on how the courses are well- organized and career oriented. The response is- 35.86% alumni regarded it as

The response is- 44.62% alumni regarded it as excellent, 32.67% regarded it as very good and 16.73% regarded it as good. Only 1.99% alumni are not satisfied with it. The Average score of this question is 4.13.

The response is- 41.04% alumni regarded it as excellent, 36.65% regarded it as very good and 13.94% regarded it as good. Only 1.59% alumni are not satisfied with it. The Average score of this question is 4.08.


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5. Curriculum provides a good mix of theoretical and experiential learning

The Average score of this question is 3.87.

The response is- 39.44% alumni regarded it as excellent, 35.46% regarded it as very good and 14.34% regarded it as good. Only 3.19% alumni are not satisfied with it. The Average score of this question is 4.00.

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
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7. Academic experience was pleasant and supportive

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



1. Updated, diverse and career-oriented Curriculum and Syllabus





3. The course has good balance between theory and application



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
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4. Scope to update and modify syllabus through proper forums such as BoS


5. Academic liberty in teaching and evaluation


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6. Proper assessment of student learning







SL No.	Feedback	Action Taken
01	Introduction of more industry relevant courses	More Industry oriented revised curriculum, which includes compulsory skill enhancement courses, was deliberated upon in the 11 th and 12 th Meetings of the Academic Council and approved. This new curriculum was implemented from 2022 onwards.
02	Giving more emphasize on internship	Internship is compulsory in all programmes.
03	Giving more emphasize on Research	 (i) Minor and major projects are compulsory both at the UG and PG levels. (ii) Introduction of mandatory dissertation at PG level (4th Semester)
04	Promoting Skill based course	All programmes offer compulsory Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) of 2 credits starting from semester-1 upto semester-6 at UG level and from semester -2 to Semester-3 at PG level.
