## **OBSERVER SPEAKS**

Royal Times, RGU in Conversation with Prof. (Dr.) Bala Lakhendra, Observer, AIU

#### Q: How is your experience of Karmotsav 2.0?

A: The experience has been great. This is not the first time RGU has organized KARMOTSAV, even in 2019 RGU had organized this festival; at that time many universities from entire East Zone under AIU, including Banaras Hindu University and Viswa Bharati University were a part of this festival. For the second time, this assignment has been given to RGU. At that time, RGU was only two years old and they had organized such a huge festival and even then the management was so good. From 2019 to 2024 the University has really grown in terms of infrastructure and in terms of student strength. After almost four years, RGU is again hosting this festival, this time as North East Zone and this time also the arrangement has been excellent-food, hygiene, organisers, event coordinators, all the volunteers, time management-everything is top notch. I would definitely say that KARMOTSAV 2.0 is a grand success.

### Q: You have stayed in Assam earlier and have visited North East India on many occasions. How has the region evolved over the years in your opinion?

A: I joined Tezpur University in 2009 and from that year onwards we started this youth festival movement in North East. For the first time in the region, in 2010 Tezpur University hosted the East Zone festival. At that time only 2/3 universities were active-Tezpur University, Gauhati University, and Manipur University. But today there are so many universities actively participating in the festival. The competition nowadays in the region is so tough that judges have a hard time deciding on the winners. In terms of youth festival and in terms of infrastructure North East has excelled in many areas, including your own university. And newer universities are coming up. The students of North East India are really really very good. In terms of talent North East is moving ahead.

#### Q: What message would you like to give our youth?

A: In the inaugural session the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of this University, Prof. (Dr.) S.P. Singh sir had said, "karma hi pooja hain" and so he had named the festival KARMOTSAV. India is your country and you work hard, students from North East are doing quite well at the national level and the international level. My advice and my request to all the students is: work hard, study sincerely and participate regularly in activities like dance, song, etc. and make your region proud and make your country a great one.
