

OBLIGATION OF GOVERNMENT TO IMPLEMENT CONSTITUTIONAL MANDATE ON RIGHT TO EDUCATION

Introduction:

While Indian Constitution adopted for the nation, education was put in part IV (Directive Principles of State Policy). But subsequently it was observed that the growth of illiteracy was higher than the growth of literacy. Thus, discussion to include education as Fundamental Right began. After long deliberation and debate, elementary education was included as

Fundamental Right. It is historic so far as development of the nation. Literacy is the key of development and progress, socio-economically. Illiteracy is a curse on a state. The root cause of all evils is illiteracy. It creates blind beliefs as it creates circumstance of distrust among people. As a progressive state, India has implemented the "The right of children to free and compulsory education Act,

2009" which is popularly known as Right to Education (RTE) Act 2009.

Liability of State:

The Constitution of India in part IV under Directive Principles of State Policy specifically mandated the State to ensure the right of education to its citizen.

Article 41 of the Constitution on Right to work, to education and to public assistance in



certain cases states as "The State shall, within the limits of its economic capacity and development, make effective provision for securing the right to work, to education and to public assistance in cases of unemployment, old age, sickness and disablement, and in other cases of undeserved want."

Universal schooling accompanied by quality, equity and accessibility can be a single big move

towards attaining future prosperity of every nation.

Article 45 which originally stated: "The State shall endeavour to provide, within a period of ten years from the commencement of this Constitution, for free and compulsory education for all children until they complete the age of fourteen years."

Constitution was amended and the time frame of 'ten years' was removed by 86th amendment and substituted by "The State shall endeavour to provide early childhood care and education for all children until they complete the age of six years."

In the same stress Constitution provide in Article 46 on 'Promotion of educational and economic interests of Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other weaker sections' as "The State shall promote with special care the


